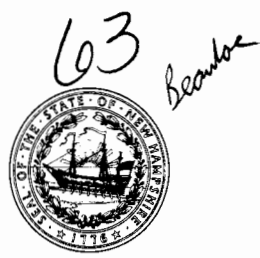

REQUESTED ACTION

Approve Sprague Operating Resources' request to perform the following work on the Piscataqua River, in Newington. File # 2013-02919. This project will not have significant impact on or adversely affect the values of the Piscataqua River.

An amendment request received on July 10, 2014, requested to impact an additional 425 sq. ft. for "in-kind" reconstruction of the manifold platform to support vehicular access, lengthen 10 pile caps, and deck widening at the manifold platform.

The Department imposed the following conditions as part of this approval:

1. **AMENDED:** All work shall be in accordance with plans by Appledore Marine Engineering dated October 2013, as received by the NH Department of Environmental Services (DES) on December 5, 2013 and plans dated June 17, 2014 as received by DES on July 10, 2014.
2. Any further alteration of areas on this property that are within the jurisdiction of the DES Wetlands Bureau will require a new application and further permitting by the Bureau.
3. This permit does not allow dredging for any purpose.
4. Appropriate siltation/erosion/turbidity controls shall be in place prior to construction, shall be maintained during construction, and shall remain in place until the area is stabilized.
5. Work shall be done during low tide.
6. Work shall be conducted in a manner so as to minimize turbidity and sedimentation to surface waters and wetlands.
7. Work shall be conducted in a manner that avoids excessive discharges of sediments to fish spawning areas.
8. Within three days of final grading or temporary suspension of work, all exposed soil areas shall be stabilized by seeding and mulching during the growing season, or if not within the growing season, by mulching with tack or netting and pinning on slopes steeper than 3:1.

9. Construction equipment shall be inspected daily for leaking fuel, oil and hydraulic fluid prior to entering surface waters or wetlands. Faulty equipment shall be repaired prior to entering jurisdictional areas.
10. The contractor shall have appropriate oil spill kits on site and readily accessible at all times during construction and each operator shall be trained in its use.
11. All refueling of equipment shall occur outside of surface waters or wetlands.

EXPLANATION

The DES Wetlands Bureau approved this project on February 1, 2016. DES supported its decision with the following findings:

DES reaffirms finding no.'s 1 - 8:

1. This is a major impact project per Administrative Rule Env-Wt 303.02(a), projects in tidal wetlands.
2. The need for the proposed impacts has been demonstrated by the applicant per Env-Wt 302.01. The industrial access trestle pier, which supports several product off-load pipelines, is severely deteriorated and needs to be replaced. Further, the shoreline is eroding where the pier structure meets the shoreline and needs to be stabilized
3. The applicant has provided evidence which demonstrates that this proposal is the alternative with the least adverse impact to areas and environments under the department's jurisdiction per Env-Wt 302.03. The pier will be replaced within the same footprint and will reduce the number of pilings needed from the existing 39 H-pilings to 28 new steel pilings. The rip rap is proposed to run with the contour of the existing slope and blend into the river bottom without extending out further than necessary to withstand the tidal power of the Piscataqua River.
4. The applicant has demonstrated by plan and example that each factor listed in Env-Wt 302.04(a) and (c), Requirements for Application Evaluation, has been considered in the design of the project. No species of concern were reported for the project vicinity by the NH Natural Heritage Bureau.
5. Compensatory mitigation is not required for this project, pursuant to Env-Wt 303.03(c)(2)c., as the project is to protect existing infrastructure including marine vessel access at an existing oil tank farm facility important to the public interest.
6. The Newington Conservation Commission recommends approval of the project.
7. DES conducted a field inspection of the project site on January 10, 2014, and found that the site conditions are accurately represented in the file.
8. In accordance with RSA 428-A:8, DES finds that the requirements for a public hearing do not apply as the permitted project is not of substantial public interest, and will not have a significant impact on or adversely affect the values of the tidal resource, as identified under RSA 482-A:1.

This letter is a request for amendment to NHDES Permit #2013-02919 for Sprague Operating Resources' Access Trestle Replacement project located in Newington, NH. This project includes replacing the existing deteriorated Access Trestle which provides vehicle and pedestrian access as well as product piping from shore to the pile supported Manifold Platform structure in the Piscataqua River. A recent structural analysis was performed on the Manifold Platform structure and the results indicate the structure is deficient for the proposed facility operations. As such, an amendment is requested to strengthen the existing pile supported Manifold Platform.

Attached are supporting figures depicting the proposed work. The strengthening will require partial removal of the existing concrete edge beam and deck. Six new concrete filled 16 inch diameter steel pipe piles will be driven within this removed section and a new cast-in-place concrete deck placed.

The approved permit allows for 28 steel pipe piles to be driven for construction of the Access Trestle replacement project. During the final stages of design, we were able to reduce the number of required steel pipe piles to 21 for the Access Trestle. Adding an additional 6 piles required for the Manifold Platform strengthening, the total number of steel pipe piles is 27, which is less than the approved 28 piles. The proposed strengthening will not change the overall structure's footprint.

An updated and tentative project schedule includes: Contractor Pre-bid walkthrough in mid-June with bids due mid-July. Construction would begin in September and completion of project in early December.

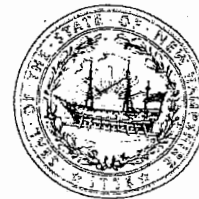

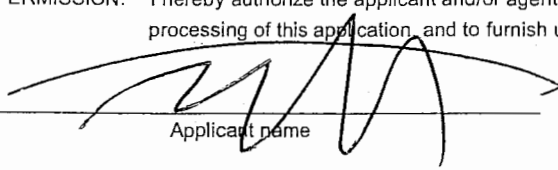

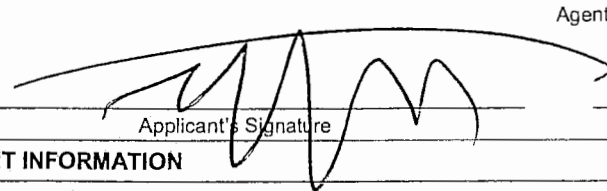

Replacement of an access trestle on the Piscataqua River. The existing structure (261'L x 22'W) will be removed. The new structure (261'L x 25'W) will be installed in the same location. The new design is similar to the existing structure, but will reduce the number of steel pilings from 39 H-pilings to 28 steel pipe pilings of 16" diameter. The application seeks a permit for work in a tidal river and the surface impacts for removal and installation of the pilings. New pilings will be mechanically driven below the mudline, and no dredging is proposed. Shoreline stabilization will be included in the area immediately around the first row of piles of the trestle.

The removal of the existing H-piles will require approximately 39 sf of surface disturbance. The installation of the new steel pipe piles will require approximately 39 sf of new surface disturbance.

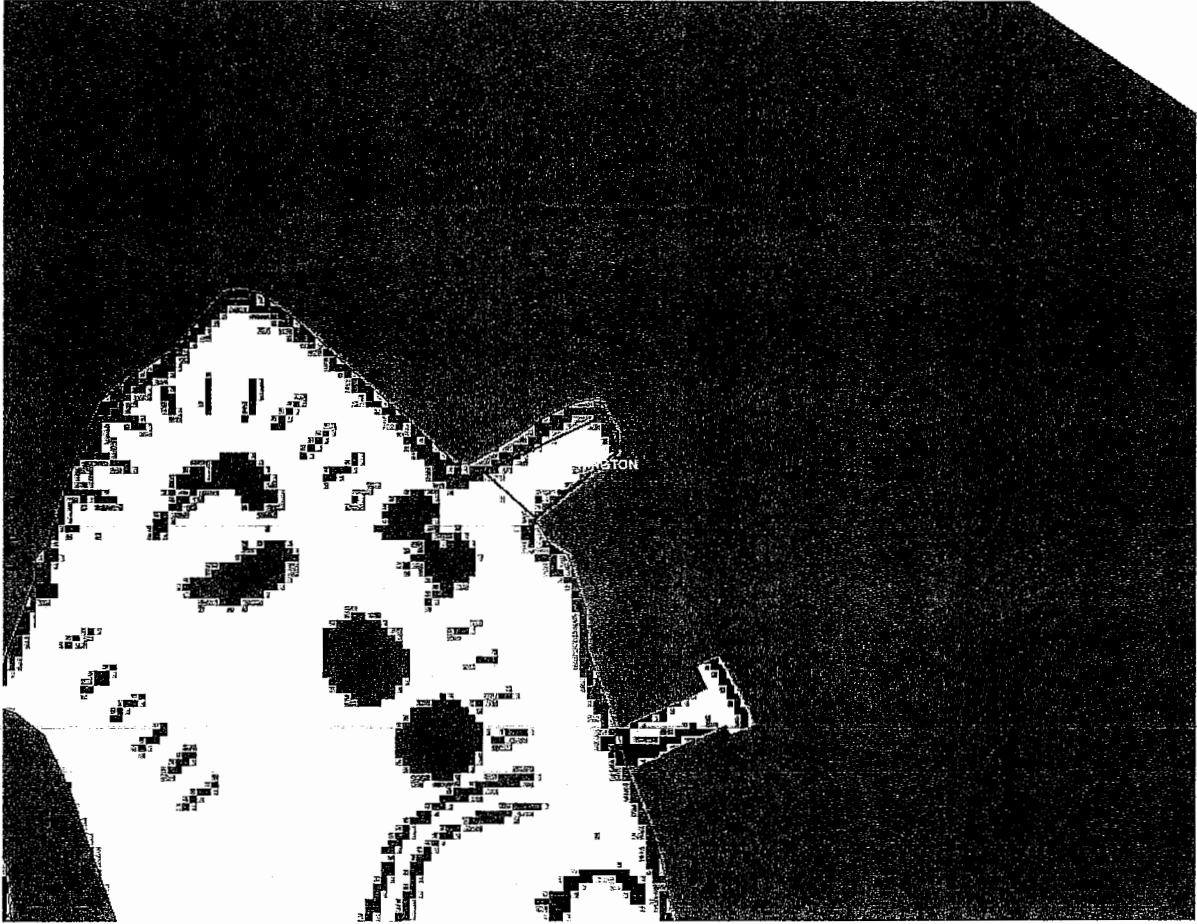
The NH Natural Heritage database has been checked for records of rare species and exemplary natural communities near the area mapped below. The species considered include those listed as Threatened or Endangered by either the state of New Hampshire or the federal government. We currently have no recorded occurrences for sensitive species near this project area.

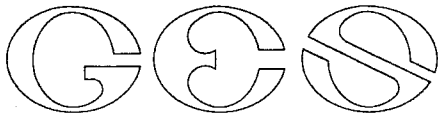
A negative result (no record in our database) does not mean that a sensitive species is not present. Our data can only tell you of known occurrences, based on information gathered by qualified biologists and reported to our office. However, many areas have never been surveyed, or have only been surveyed for certain species. An on-site survey would provide better information on what species and communities are indeed present.
