REQUESTED ACTION

The Board of Pharmacy requests to place this item on the Consent Calendar.

- 1) Authorize Michelle Ricco Jonas, PDMP Program Manager for the New Hampshire Board of Pharmacy, to attend the 31st Annual Conference of the National Association of State Controlled Substance Authorities (NASCSA) to be held October 19, 2015 through October 24, 2015 in Scottsdale, AZ, effective upon Governor and Council approval.
- 2) Further authorize her, pursuant to RSA 4:8, and Administrative Rule 311.10, to accept complimentary scholarship from NASCSA including admission to the scheduled conference and travel, accommodations not to exceed \$ 1,500.

EXPLANATION

The National Association of State Controlled Substances Authorities is a 501(C)(3) non-profit educational organization established in 1985. NASCSA's primary purpose is to provide a continuing mechanism through which state and federal agencies, as well as others can work to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of state and national efforts to prevent and control drug diversion and abuse, provide a network for State Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs and to provide an educational forum to further this purpose. NASCSA members support and endorse laws, rules, and regulations to ensure that controlled substances are accessible to those persons who have a legitimate medical need. NASCSA has worked cooperatively with a number of organizations including the US Drug Enforcement Administration, US Food and Drug Administration, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, National Institute on Drug Abuse, National Alliance for Model State Drug Laws, state professional licensing boards, pharmaceutical companies, and other national associations.

Michelle Ricco Jonas, PDMP Program Manager, will learn valuable and timely information and be able to network with her peers from other state PDMP's. The conference forum is specifically geared to support state controlled substance authorities in the areas of prescription drug abuse, prescription monitoring and drug diversion.

On behalf of the Executive Committee of the National Association of State Controlled Substances Authorities I am pleased to inform you that you have been awarded a travel scholarship up to \$1500 to attend this year's annual conference October 19-23, 2015 at the Hotel Valley Ho in Scottsdale, Arizona. There were many worthy applicants as states are certainly facing difficult financial times. Due to our fiscal conservative positions over the years we are able to offer travel scholarships to our member states during times like these and it is something we are very proud of. Our hope is that you will continue to stay active in NASCSA and spread the word to your colleagues and others you may encounter both in the regulatory, law enforcement communities as well as with industry representatives as NASCSA is the only national organization devoted solely to the broad range of controlled substances issues that continues to flourish and welcomes the input from all of those interested in the appropriate use of controlled substances while controlling abuse.

A few housekeeping issues:

- 1) Your state must have its membership dues paid in full prior to the conference in order to be eligible for the scholarship (as of today, New Hampshire's dues are paid)
- 2) Please use the attached expense form which must be used in order to be reimbursed for expenses – you must also attach receipts (for the most part people are using their personal credit cards so I promise to reimburse you promptly. If you wish, you could book your flight, send me that expense form and then hotel and other travel related expenses you can submit a second one following the conference so you're not carrying the bill for long).
- 3) Maximum travel amount is \$1500. In the event your state receives a federal grant that includes money for travel (you may not know it now obviously), and you can utilize the federal grant for travel expenses I would appreciate it if you would let me know so that we could potentially award the scholarship to an alternate we have selected in this event.
- 4) Please make sure you complete and fax, mail or email the registration form found [here](#) and attached ASAP. While the fee is waived, it helps me stay organized for the conference and ensures I have all your current contact information properly. The program agenda is found attached

If for some reason you are unable to attend the conference please let me know as soon as possible as we have selected alternates for the travel scholarship.

Please note that there will be a session on Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs Tuesday morning so we would encourage you to attend that session as well.


