REQUESTED ACTION


That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to reappoint Scott K. Gilbert (Position #9U274, Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2610-014-500134) as a Criminal Justice Investigator at a salary level of \$76,427.52 (LG BB, Step 6) effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or May 27, 2021, whichever is later. Mr. Gilbert will be occupying a position with a term ending May 27, 2026.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Gilbert has over 35 years of experience in law enforcement.
