REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to accept and expend \$450,000 in Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Funds for the purpose of continuing emergency drought assistance to low-income residential well owners, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2023. 100% Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund.

EXPLANATION

On October 23, 2020, the Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund (DWGTF) Advisory Commission awarded \$1.5M to NHDES to provide short-term relief and financial assistance in the form of reimbursements for low-income New Hampshire homeowners served by residential wells that are experiencing insufficient water or no water due to drought conditions. This reimbursement funding was originally approved by the Fiscal Committee and Governor & Council in November of 2020 and approval to accept the unspent balance of the \$1.5M award into this biennium was given in August of 2021.

On September 13, 2021, the DWGTF Advisory Commission awarded an additional \$450,000 to NHDES to continue to provide short-term relief and financial assistance in the form of reimbursements for low-income New Hampshire homeowners served by residential wells that are experiencing insufficient water due to drought conditions, and also to expand the scope of assistance to include treatment of replacement supply wells having naturally occurring contaminants above drinking water standards. The ongoing program has to date received approximately 109 applications and completed 54 projects. The program has thus far reimbursed approximately \$877,170 to homeowners and approximately \$620,000 more is obligated for approved projects.


As of October 14, 2021, areas of Coos county are still experiencing levels of moderate to severe drought. While the program has sunset in southern counties, applications are still being received for Coos, Grafton and Carroll counties. The additional funding will be used to continue to provide financial assistance for drought relief to those three counties and retroactively address water quality issues for completed projects and new projects going forward.

The purpose of this request is to authorize NHDES to accept the additional \$450,000 award into class 300 Reimbursements. This will enable NHDES to continue approving projects and reimbursing eligible homeowners selected on the basis of household income, thus supporting New Hampshire citizens that have been hardest hit by the drought.

NHDES is requesting to budget these additional funds as shown below:

Class 300 To reimburse costs incurred by eligible homeowners whose wells have run dry for remedies to include a temporary auxiliary storage tank and bulk water, increasing storage capacity, lowering an existing well pump, deepening an existing well, installing a replacement well, and water quality sampling and treatment of the deepened/replacement well.
