**REQUESTED ACTION**

Approve Fisher Family Trust's request to perform work on Lake Winnepesaukee in Wolfeboro as outlined below. This request is pursuant to New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) file #2021-02068. This project will not have significant impact on, or adversely affect, the values of Lake Winnepesaukee. No comments were submitted by the Wolfeboro Conservation Commission regarding this project as proposed.

Permanently remove an existing 4 foot x 41 foot cantilevered pier with one 6 foot x 33 foot and two 4 foot x 28 foot permanent finger piers in an "E" configuration, relocate approximately 250 cubic yards of rock fill on 2,222 square feet of lakebed to construct 70 linear feet of breakwater in a dog-leg configuration with a 4 foot x 30 foot and 4 foot x 32 foot cantilevered piers, accessed by a 5 foot x 20 foot walkway, dredge 16.3 cubic yards from 604 square feet of lake bed and impact 1,660 square feet of bank along 49 linear feet of shoreline to construct an 894 square foot "dug-in" boathouse on 347 feet of frontage along the southern portion of Wolfeboro Neck on Lake Winnepesaukee in Wolfeboro.

The NHDES imposed the following conditions as part of this approval:

1. In accordance with Env-Wt 307.16, all work shall be done in accordance with the revised plans revision dated August 27, 2021 by White Mountain Survey & Engineering, as received by the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) on August 31, 2021.
2. This permit shall not be effective until it has been recorded in the Carrol County Registry of Deeds and a copy of the recorded permit has been provided to the department as required pursuant to RSA 482-A:3, and Env-Wt 314.02.
3. If blasting is required, a licensed blaster will provide timing, sequencing and any other appropriate documents to NHDES prior to commencing work.
4. Any subdivision of the property frontage will require removal of a sufficient portion of the docking structures to comply with the dock size and density requirements in effect at the time of the subdivision as required to maintain compliance with Env-Wt 314.02 and Env-Wt 513.12.
5. Only those structures shown on the approved plans shall be installed or constructed along this frontage as required per Env-Wt 513.22, (a).
6. All portions of the docking structures, including the breakwater toe -of-slope, shall be located at least 20 feet from the abutting property lines and no watercraft shall be secured to the docking facility such that it crosses over the imaginary extension of the property lines over the surface water as required by RSA 482-A:3, XIII.

7. The use of the boathouse shall be limited to the storage of boats and boating-related accessories.
8. The boathouse shall be a single-story structure; ridgeline not to exceed 20 feet in height (Elev. 524.32) above normal high water (Elev. 504.32).
9. Discharge from dewatering of work areas shall be to sediment basins that are: a) located in uplands; b) lined with hay bales or other acceptable sediment trapping liners; and c) set back as far as possible from wetlands and surface waters, with a preferred undisturbed vegetated buffer of at least 50 feet and a minimum undisturbed vegetative buffer of 20 feet.
10. The owner understands and accepts the risk that if this facility requires dredging to maintain a minimum slip depth of 3 feet more frequently than once every 6 years, or is shown to have an adverse impact on abutting frontages, it shall be subject to removal.
11. This facility is permitted with the condition that future maintenance dredging, if needed, shall not be permitted more frequently than once every 6 years, and that a new permit shall be required for each dredge activity.
12. The permittee/permittee's contractor shall revegetate the disturbed area with trees, shrubs and ground covers representing the density and species diversity of the existing stand of vegetation removed for this project, exclusive of any invasive or nuisance species.
13. The use of this structure shall be limited to the docking and securing of watercraft as required to comply with Env-Wt 307.09.
14. Owners of permanent docking structures which are not maintained so as to be structurally sound and usable for their intended purpose shall remove those docking structures in accordance with Env-Wt 513.22(c), to prevent hazards to public safety, navigation, and recreation.
15. The owner understands and accepts that should these docking structures be found to have an unreasonable impact on the ability of abutting owners to use and enjoy their properties or the public's right to navigation, passage, and use of the resource for commerce and recreation the structures shall be subject to removal pursuant to RSA 482-A:1, RSA 482-A:11, II, and Env-Wt 513.03(a).
16. No agitating or heating device shall be installed for the purpose of inhibiting the formation of ice in proximity to the approved structures unless it has been registered with the municipal clerk of the town in which such device shall be operated pursuant to RSA 270:34 Registration Required.
17. Pursuant to RSA 270:33, Heating, Agitating, or Other Devices in Public Waters; Safety Hazard, no agitating or heating device installed in accordance with RSA 270:34 shall inhibit or prevent the natural formation of ice in such a manner as to impede either the ingress or egress to or from the ice from any property other than that of the owner of the device.
18. All development activities associated with any project shall be conducted in compliance with applicable requirements of RSA 483-B and Env-Wq 1400 during and after construction as required pursuant to RSA 483-B:3.
19. Work authorized shall be carried out in accordance with Env-Wt 307 such that appropriate turbidity controls are in place to protect water quality, that no turbidity escapes the immediate dredge area, and that appropriate turbidity controls shall remain until suspended particles have settled and water at the work site has returned to normal clarity.
20. All dredged and excavated material and construction-related debris shall be placed outside of those areas subject to RSA 482-A or RSA-483-B unless a permit for the deposition of materials within those areas has been obtained as required per RSA 482-A:3 or RSA 483-B:5-b respectively.

21. No activity shall be conducted in such a way as to cause or contribute to any violation of surface water quality standards specified in RSA 485-A:8 or Env-Wq 1700.
22. Pursuant to RSA 482-A:14, RSA 482-A:14-b, and RSA 482-A:14-c, NHDES is authorized to take appropriate compliance actions should it be determined that, based upon additional information which becomes available, any of the structures depicted as "existing" on the plans submitted by or on behalf of the permittee were not previously permitted or grandfathered.


#### EXPLANATION

The NHDES approved this project on September 29, 2021. The NHDES supported its decision with the following findings:

1. This is a major impact project per Administrative Rule Env-Wt 512.06(a), construction of a breakwater.
2. The applicant has an average of 347 feet of frontage along Lake Winnepesaukee.
3. A maximum of 5 slips may be permitted on this frontage per Rule Env-Wt 513.12, Frontage Requirements for Private and Non-commercial Docking Structures.
4. The proposed docking facility will provide 4 slips as defined per RSA 482-A:2, VIII, and therefore meets Rule Env-Wt 513.12.
5. The NHDES finds that because the project is not of significant public interest and will not significantly impair the resources of Lake Winnepesaukee a public hearing under RSA 482-A:8 is not required.
6. Neither the abutters nor the Wolfeboro Conservation Commission submitted any comments related to the project.
7. The NHDES finds that the project as proposed and conditioned meets the requirements of RSA 482-A and the Wetlands Program Code of Administrative Rules Chapters Env-Wt 100 - 900. No waivers of RSA 482-A or the Wetlands Program Code of Administrative Rules Chapters Env-Wt 100 - 900 were requested or approved under this permit action.

Application file documents are being forwarded to the Governor and the Executive Council in connection with their consideration of this matter pursuant to RSA 482-A:3, II(a), as it is a major project in public waters of the state.

The proposed project has been designed to be the least intrusive upon the public trust as possible. The elements in this project were designed in strict adherence with the requirements in chapter 500. The breakwater will provide a 6 foot gap between it and the reference line and will not extend further than 50' measured at the Reference line. The proposed permanent dock will not impact the lakebed; it will be smaller than the existing permanent dock which meets the requirements in chapter 500. The boathouse will be located inland of the reference line and will be constructed in accordance with chapter 500 rules and regulations. The applicant has requested a waiver for the functional assessment as no wetlands were observed in the location of the proposed development.
