EXPLANATION

gathering and analysis, issuing of Letter of Findings, monitoring of Volunteer Compliance Plans, and submitting a Biennial Report to the US-DOE. Additionally, Katherine manages the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Center Renovation Projects, which consist of; providing technical assistance, reviewing application materials, monitoring project budgets, determining allowable expenses, processing reimbursement request and submitting capital budget updates. The course, Negotiation, Contracting, and Procurement, will benefit the Department and Katherine by increasing her knowledge and understanding of the functions of an effective project manager, and will assist in gaining the skills and proficiency needed to be an innovative project leader. Negotiation, Contracting, and Procurement explores contract elements, basic contracting terms and their application to the negotiating process. Common contract types and their application to the real world as well as application of federal regulations. Negotiation, Contracting, and Procurement applies to task that she completes in her daily work for the department, including project planning, negotiating compliance plans, scheduling, and analysis. As well, as effective management strategies and communicate with stakeholders' to effectively, manage expectations.

Course content will give Katherine the formal education in project management, negotiations, and contracts that she lacks because she has only had on the job training and is seeking to enhance and deepen her knowledge of project management as well as learn about additional tools and best practices to bring to her work allowing her to improve in these areas.

The Department of Education encourages and supports employees who wish to further their professional growth through continuing education in disciplines that are mutually advantageous. Successful completion of the program will add to the overall strength of the Department to perform its mission to the students of New Hampshire.

This course will not be taken on State time.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
EDUCATIONAL TUITION AGREEMENT
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Agreement dated this 8th day of November 2021 by and through the Department of Education (hereinafter referred to as the "State") and Katherine Page (hereinafter referred to as the "Recipient"). The State and the Recipient do hereby mutually agree as follows:

1. The State shall pay to the named institution the sum of \$1,291.20, which monies shall be used for the purpose of enrolling the Recipient in: Negotiation, Contracting, and Procurement, which course(s) is being offered by Granite State College and which course(s) shall commence on January 3, 2022 and terminate on March 25, 2022.
2. The Recipient shall complete and achieve a passing grade in each course named in paragraph 1.
3. Should the Recipient fail to complete or achieve a passing grade in each course named in paragraph 1, the Recipient shall pay to the State the sum set forth in paragraph 1, provided, however, that if more than one course is named in paragraph 1, the amount which shall be paid to the State shall be calculated on a pro rata basis.
4. Upon the satisfactory completion of the courses named in paragraph 1, the Recipient shall continue in the employ of the State in his/her current position (or in such other position, at equal or greater compensation, to which he/she may be assigned) for a period of six (6) months.
5. The Recipient shall work in any area of the State to which he/she may be assigned, provided that such assignment will not constitute a severe hardship to said Recipient.
6. Should the Recipient breach any of the conditions set forth in paragraphs 4 and 5, the Recipient shall pay to the State a sum equal to all monies previously paid by the State for the Recipient pursuant to the Agreement, provided, however, that the Recipient shall receive a credit for each month in which he/she is employed by the State subsequent to the date upon which the named course(s) are satisfactorily completed, the value of said credit to be calculated on a pro rata basis.
7. The Recipient shall not raise any setoff or counterclaim against the State in any action brought by the State to collect any amount due under this agreement.
8. Should any amount be found to be due the State in any action brought against the Recipient pursuant to this Agreement, the State shall, in addition to said amount, be entitled to an award of costs and a reasonable amount in "attorney" fees.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the representatives of the State, in his/her official capacity only, and without personal liability, and the Recipient, have hereunto set their hands on the date first above written.

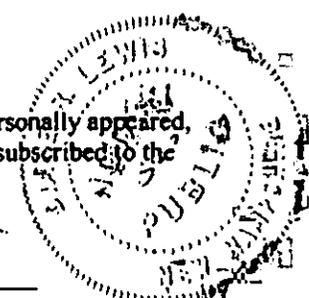
