**REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the New Hampshire Department of Education (NHDOE) to enter into grant agreements and or contracts with various vendors without further Governor and Executive Council (G&C) approval, for a total amount not to exceed \$6,498,664.00 to support the American Rescue Plan Act; Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools Program (ARP EANS), effective upon G&C approval through June 30, 2023: 100% Federal Funds.

**EXPLANATION**

On January 30, 2021 His Excellency, Governor Christopher T. Sununu granted the NHDOE the authority to accept and expend Coronavirus Response and Relief and Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act; Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools (EANS I) funds, including the authority to enter into grant agreements and or contracts with various vendors under RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4 of EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-A4, AS EXTENDED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2010-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-18, 2020-20, 2020-21, 2020-23, 2020-24, 2020-25, and 2021-01 AND SUSPEND THE MANUAL OF PROCEDURES 150, V., A., 5 REQUIREMENT. (Informational G&C item #BB, dated 05/19/21)

Under EANS I, the NHDOE provided, via the Department of Administrative Services (DAS), \$6,725,205.89 in services and assistance to participating non-public schools. These funds were distributed based on each school's approved requests for specific services and assistance.

Continuing the support provided under CRRSA's EANS I, the Fiscal Committee and G&C has authorized the NHDOE to accept and expend ARP EANS funds in the amount of \$6,987,847 from the United States

Department of Education (USED) (Fiscal item FIS 21-324, dated 11/19/21 and G&C item #92, dated 11/22/21). 100% Federal Funds.<sup>1</sup>

Unlike EANS I, under the ARP Act and USED requirements, NHDOE and other state departments of education may only provide ARP EANS services or assistance to non-public schools that 1) enroll a significant percentage of students from low-income families and 2) are most impacted by the novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) emergency.

On September 9, 2021, NHDOE submitted an application to the USED with a proposed allocation methodology that the USED approved on October 25, 2021. In this USED-approved application, NHDOE defined a "significant percentage of students from low-income families" as those schools equal to or greater than 21.84 percent poverty. This percentage was selected because it is the statewide average percentage of free or reduced-price lunch eligible elementary and secondary students (grades 1-12) in school districts receiving ARP ESSER subgrants using the most recently available data (2020-2021). NHDOE defined the "most impacted by COVID-19 emergency" as:

- 1) The COVID-19 infections per 100,000 is higher than State average in the county in which the non-public school is located or the county in which the majority of the non-public school's enrolled students reside; or
- 2) The COVID-19 related deaths per 100,000 is higher than State average in the county in which the non-public school is located or the county in which the majority of the non-public school's enrolled students reside.<sup>2</sup>

Based on this methodology, please see the total support for which each non-public school participating in EANS I is eligible for under ARP EANS based on poverty data submitted under EANS I:<sup>3</sup>

Federal requirements under both EANS I and ARP EANS do not allow for the provision of funds to the non-public schools and, instead, require the NHDOE to provide the necessary and reasonable services and assistance to non-public schools.

Under EANS I the NHDOE entered into an agreement with the DAS to procure the services and assistance. The approval of EANS I, "authorize[d] the NHDOE to enter into grant agreements and/or contracts with various vendors, for the total amount not to exceed \$6,987,847 to support EANS activities, such as those listed below, effective upon G&C approval through June 30, 2023. 100% Federal Funds."

The NHDOE is now requesting that the G&C allow the NHDOE to use the same method of procurement approved for EANS I in the administration of ARP EANS funds.

Under the ARP Act, the ARP EANS funds are to be used to support services and assistance such as:

- Supplies to sanitize, disinfect, and clean school facilities;
- Personal protective equipment;

Under the ARP EANS program, non-public schools submit applications for allowable assistance and support until March 31, 2022. Non-public schools that meet the application requirements will have their requests processed, either by the NHDOE or by NHDAS, and goods and services delivered to the non-public school. Should non-public schools that meet the application requirements choose not to participate or not to utilize the total support for which they are eligible, participating non-public schools that meet the application requirements will have the opportunity to utilize those funds for subsequent priorities of allowable assistance and support.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this request.
