Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, to accept and expend federal pass-through funds in the amount of \$67,000.00 from the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety for the purpose of purchasing fifty (50) LIDAR speed-measuring devices. EXPLANATION

In an effort to perform effective speed enforcement on multi-lane roads throughout the state, the NH State Police requests authorization to accept \$67,000 to purchase fifty (50) Prolaser 4 LIDAR speed-measuring devices. These devices will supplement speed enforcement efforts currently conducted with Doppler radar. This equipment will help to provide the tools necessary for use in speed enforcement, in order to minimize the potential of speed related crashes and the resulting injuries and fatalities on the roadways in the State of New Hampshire.

The funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Funds in Class 30 are needed to purchase fifty (50) Prolaser 4 LIDAR speed-measuring devices.

Funds in Class 40 are not appropriated, because we do not pay indirect cost on class 30.


Funds in Class 41 are not appropriated, because the department that receives the Federal grant from the federal granting agency is responsible for paying the audit fund set aside.

Although the Department included this grant in the SFY 2022 budget, the amount of the Federal grant received is higher than what was budgeted, therefore requiring the above requested action. If this request is not approved Federal funds could be lost, therefore the above requested action is needed to fully utilize the federal grant funds.

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In the event that Intra Agency Transfers becomes no longer available General and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.
