EXPLANATION

The original IMLS ARPA grant amount of \$2,297,692 was approved through June 30, 2021 by Governor and Council on May 19, 2021, Item #56, as well as the Joint Legislative Fiscal Committee on May 21, 2021, FIS 21-122, for FY21 expenditures. FY 22 & 23 budget expenditures through June 30, 2023 were approved through Governor & Council on August 18, 2021, item #73 as well as the Joint Legislative Fiscal Committee on August 20, 2021 FIS 21-219. The bottom-line figure of \$2,113,368 in those last approvals in August 2021 reflects the remainder of the IMLS ARPA funds not spent by June 30, 2021. Funds spent in FY21 were \$164,324 for direct sub-grants to 77 public libraries across the state.

At this time, we ask for approval to transfer funds between classes in this accounting unit in order to fulfill our responsibility to spend the funds for the purposes outlined by the Institute of Museum and Library Services in their April 9, 2021 notification:

Class 026 – Organizational Dues – Additional appropriation is needed in order to allow us to pay for year two of the Digital Public Library Membership for all public libraries in the state.

Class 030 – Equipment New Replacement – Additional appropriations needed to purchase 12 coding robots that would be shared among NH public libraries, instead of purchasing a high-end book scanner. We determined that we could use the high-end book scanner at the State Archives instead of purchasing one for our building. These robots will foster collaboration between public libraries and school districts across the state.

Class 039 – Telecommunications – Appropriation reduction due to cost for upgrading the NH State Library’s 2nd floor Wi-Fi is under budget and nearing completion.

Class 057 – Books, periodicals, and subscriptions – Additional appropriations needed to enhance our ability to provide statewide services to NH public libraries and continue to purchase statewide subscriptions and resources for NH public libraries.

Class 072 – Grants Federal – Appropriation reductions as a result of change in grants program being extended. We initially thought that three sub-grant rounds would occur for NH public libraries. The second sub-grant round competitive awards were \$325,442 more than anticipated due to the quality and number of competitive projects proposed. Therefore, we will not run a third subgrant round with the smaller amount of funds left budgeted for this purpose. Instead, we are spending more on statewide subscriptions and materials that go directly to all public libraries.

Class 102 – Contracts for Program Services – Appropriation reductions due to not spending as much for contracts for Program Services as initially planned to include microfilming, workshop presenters, etc.

In the event that Federal Funds become unavailable, General Funds will not be requested.

REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, New Hampshire State Library, to **Retroactively** amend Fiscal Item #FIS 21-122 approved on May 21, 2021 and Governor and Executive Council Item #56 approved on May 19, 2021 by extending the end date from June 30, 2021 to June 30, 2023 effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

Through the Institute of Museum and Library Services, Library Services and Technology Act (IMLS), the NH State Library has been awarded a grant from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds of \$2,297,692. The IMLS ARPA funds were allocated to each state library agency based on the formula used for the annual LSTA funding distribution. These funds are to be used for the following purposes (per IMLS notification, 4/9/2021) by September 30, 2022: to support digital inclusion efforts to enable libraries to reach residents; to provide rapid emergency relief to libraries across the country allowing them to safely respond to the pandemic and implement public health protocols; to support library services that meet the needs of communities throughout the US; and to reach tribal and museum partners best positioned to assist with pandemic response efforts. Expenditures of these funds must dovetail with the stated goals and activities in the NH State Library LSTA 5 year plan 2017-2022.

The original grant amount of \$2,297,692 was approved through June 30, 2021 by Governor and Executive Council on May 19, 2021, as well as, by the Joint Legislative Fiscal Committee on May 21, 2021 through the end of the Fiscal Year 20-21 Biennium. However, the funds were not entirely encumbered or spent by June 30, 2021. This request reflects the remainder of the funds not encumbered or spent by June 30, 2021. Funds spent in FY 21 were \$164,324 for direct sub-grants to 174 public libraries across the state.
