EXPLANATION

BEA seeks to accept and expend an additional \$40,000,000 in Coronavirus Capital Project Funds (CPF) from the United States Department of the Treasury. These funds are a part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA). The entire grant amount is \$122,066,151, that will be available for use through December 31, 2026. Of that amount, \$51,728,530 of these CPF funds were previously accepted by BEA when approved by the Fiscal Committee on July 22, 2022 (FIS 22-247) and Governor and Council on July 27, 2022 (#55).

The Broadband Connect Program was approved by U.S. Treasury on June 7, 2022. The funding will serve as the second round of the CPF program. The program is designed to fund a local internet service provider (ISP) to provide internet service to the most rural parts of the state lacking internet service – areas where it would not be possible without CPF funds. CPF is designed to fund broadband infrastructure that is designed to deliver reliable internet service that meets or exceeds 100/100 Mbps symmetrical speeds. The program also requires that the ISP takes part in the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families – and that they provide at least one low-cost option at speeds sufficient for households with multiple users to simultaneously telework and engage in remote learning.

CPF funds were used for a similar program which awarded \$50,000,000 to the NH Electric Cooperative last month to bring this high speed internet (broadband) coverage to more than 23,000 households that are currently underserved or unserved entirely. Combined with this request, these funds are expected to result in bringing broadband to approximately 40,000 households in the state.

If Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.
