### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, to accept and expend \$46,000.00 of pass-through federal funds from the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety, entitled New Hampshire State Police C.A.R. (Collision Analysis & Reconstruction) Equipment and Training Grant, to purchase equipment and training to assist with complete documentation while investigating crashes. Effective upon Governor and Council approvals through September 30, 2023. 100% Intra Agency Transfers.

### EXPLANATION

This request to accept and expend funds from the Office of Highway Safety which will enable the NH State Police Collision Analysis & Reconstruction (C.A.R) Unit to purchase equipment and attend training to increase the efficiency and timeliness of each analysis. A new Hyundai EDR Tool Kit, Kia EDR Tool kit, and (23) Nikon 18-140MM lenses will be purchased to enhance on-site data collection. Funds will also be utilized to increase training opportunities for NHSP Troopers assigned to the C.A.R. Unit. The new equipment and training opportunities are expected to help decrease case completion time from 60-90 days to 50-60 days.


Funds in class 066, Employee Training will be used to pay for registration for Crash Data Retrieval Analyst Training and the WREX Crash Reconstruction Conference.




**SCOPE OF WORK:** This amendment provides funding for the New Hampshire State Police to purchase a Hyundai EDR Tool Kit, Kia EDR Tool Kit, and twenty three (23) Nikon 18-140MM lenses, as described in the attached quotes provided by Crash Data Group and Photo & Video Hunts. Funding is also provided for the necessary training in the use of the equipment, as well as for crash reconstruction conference attendance, as described in the attached quotes provided by Collision Safety Institute and World Reconstruction Exposition. The equipment purchased, along with the training and conference education and networking will help to provide the New Hampshire State Police CA.R. Unit with the necessary tools and knowledge for use in crash reconstruction in order to provide causation information in a more efficient and timely manner. (See Exhibit B - full Scope of Work and Performance Measure/Goal attached)

The NHOHS will reimburse the NH State Police 100% of the purchase price for the equipment listed above and the associated training and conference, up to \$45,999.06. The New Hampshire State Police shall, at the conclusion of this project, provide their results and if the Highway Safety Performance Measure of having cases completed within 50-60 days rather than 60-90 days has been achieved.





**Scope of Work**  
**State Police - C.A.R. Equipment & Training**

The New Hampshire State Police will purchase the following equipment in support of their mission and responsibilities:

- Hyundai EDR Tool Kit with Software (1 year software license included) = \$4950
- Kia EDR Tool Kit with Software (1 year software license included) = \$4950
- Nikon 18-140MM lens (\$496.95 each x 23) = \$11,429.85
- Crash Data Retrieval Analyst Training (\$750 per person x 10 people) = \$7500
- WREX Crash Reconstruction Conference (\$595 per person x 5 people) = \$2975

To increase the accuracy and timeliness of completing fatal and serious injury crash reports, the New Hampshire State Police C.A.R. Unit is requesting the purchase of multiple pieces of equipment as well as specialized training. The Hyundai and Kia EDR Tool Kits will allow unit members to conduct analysis on those branded vehicles, which was not possible before, as there are no other agencies in the State of New Hampshire that have access to the kits to download these vehicles. This would allow additional investigative capabilities as well as the availability to assist other agencies in the State of New Hampshire who currently do not have access to the kits. The Nikon lens will be an extension of the existing cameras that were purchased on a previous grant. The current lens is a fixed lens, which does not allow for zoom capabilities. The addition of a second lens will allow for better close up pictures at scenes. Such images could become crucial during the continuing investigation and possibly a trial down the road where such evidence could be presented to a jury, as the scene is no longer available for review. The images act as a piece of evidence during fatal crash investigations. The Crash Data Retrieval Analyst Training will provide additional unit members with the training, allowing work to be more evenly distributed amongst unit members and allowing for more resources throughout the State of New Hampshire. The WREX Crash Reconstruction Conference would allow unit members to network with some of the top reconstruction experts throughout the country to gain experience and knowledge. It would also provide a resource for assistance in cases that might otherwise be out of their reach. The conference in the past has put on live crash demonstrations, allowing the opportunity to view the crash and compare the subsequent data analysis. It will also likely have a vendor exposition, allowing members the ability to demo the newest products available in the crash reconstruction field. All of the above listed items requested in the grant will create more capable crash reconstruction experts throughout the State of New Hampshire. By having additional skills and the tools to conduct a thorough and complete investigation, it will allow accurate and timely fatality data to be submitted to FARS and aid in prosecutions. Successful prosecution of fatal crashes involving felony level charges of Negligent Homicide and/or Manslaughter will have a direct impact on the safety of the highways in the state of New Hampshire.

**Performance Measure/Goal**

Having this training and equipment will work hand-in-hand with equipment already in service, which will help us to meet our goal of having cases completed within 50-60 days rather than 60-90 days. Additional trained investigators throughout the State will allow for faster response times to crash scenes, therefore causing less disturbance to the roadways in the State of New Hampshire and also providing more resources not only to the New Hampshire State Police, but also to other law enforcement agencies that do not have the capabilities of having a full time or even part time unit. Having additional equipment available will allow more access to vehicles that were previously inaccessible, allowing for more analysis and reconstruction to be performed for complex investigations. To our understanding there are no other agencies in the State of New Hampshire that currently have either the Hyundai or the Kia download kit.
