EXPLANATION

The Department of Education will expand implementation of the MTSS-B framework utilizing school data, such as discipline referrals, number of behavioral interventions, and student absences, to identify areas for improvement, and then determine and select appropriate evidence based interventions in response.

The Department will monitor bi-annual reports provided by the Department of Education to ensure program progress and outcomes.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request, DHHS will not have the required support to successfully implement, maintain, and improve MTSS-B program delivery to reduce the risk for youth substance misuse.



The Department of Education has been promoting this framework for over two years and schools have demonstrated interest in MTSS-B as measured by the number of schools applying for prior MTSS-B funding opportunities.

The purpose of this request is to further expand and increase capacity for MTSS-B in a minimum of three (3) additional New Hampshire school districts in response to requests for these services. The Department is seeking to extend the MOU beyond the completion date and available renewal options in response to a funding directive from the Governor's Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs. NH RSA 12-J authorizes the Commission to direct the Department to execute contracts with specific vendors without a procurement process.

Adoption of MTSS-B strategies will increase staff competencies in practices that reduce disruptive classroom behaviors, increase youth and family engagement, and encourage optimal educational outcomes, in a minimum of three (3) school districts June 30, 2023.



The Department of Education will continue implementing and maintaining the Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Health and Wellness by establishing a team to institute operating procedures, using current partnership and service contract data to determine program needs and to identify areas of redundancy with program fidelity and outcomes, measuring the benefits of program implementation and securing buy-in within education districts, community organizations, behavioral health organizations and other stakeholders within New Hampshire communities by increasing confidence in the program core features and practices.

The purpose of this request is to expand the Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Wellness program in participating New Hampshire school districts. Phase 1 of the implementation process includes the exploration of program fluency and program adoption in participating school districts.

The Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Health and Wellness will serve approximately 5,000 youth between the ages of 12 to 18 from the date of Governor and Executive Council approval to June 30, 2021.

The New Hampshire Department of Education will be implementing and maintaining the Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Health and Wellness by establishing a team to institute operating procedures, using current partnership and service contract data to determine program needs and to identify areas of redundancy with program fidelity and outcomes, measuring the benefits of program implementation and securing buy-in within education districts.

community organizations, behavioral health organizations and other stakeholders within New Hampshire communities by increasing confidence in the program core features and practices.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the New Hampshire Department of Education has established a number of operational changes to prevent and reduce the potential negative effects to meet the contract deliverables. The New Hampshire Department of Education has successfully been using e-platforms to deliver and enhance methods of communication, collaboration and planning in establishing Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Wellness in several NH districts since the onset of COVID 19.

The New Hampshire Department of Education has been able to successfully replicate the Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Wellness implementation stages relying on Zoom technology for the necessary district leadership meetings as well as Tiers 1-3 teams. The tasks that need to happen during the implementation stage will be accomplished through virtual technology (Zoom) as well as other relevant e-platforms such as email.

The Department will monitor the Memorandum of Understanding by reviewing quarterly summaries provided by the New Hampshire Department of Education on the progress of program expenditures and program outcomes.

As referenced in Section 2, Term of the attached Memorandum of Understanding, the parties have the option to extend the agreement for up to one (1) additional year, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services, available funding and Governor and Council approval.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request, behavioral health and wellness programs will not have the required support to successfully implement, maintain, and improve program delivery that reduces risk for youth substance misuse.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1.1. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is between the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Behavioral Health, Bureau of Drug and Alcohol Services, 128 Pleasant Street, Concord, NH 03301 and the New Hampshire Department of Education (DOE), 101 Pleasant Street, Concord, New Hampshire 03301 (referred to as the "Parties").
- 1.2. The purpose of this MOU is to set forth the roles and responsibilities of the DHHS and the DOE regarding the use of funds from the Governor's Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs (Governor's Commission) for the expansion of the Multi-Tiered System of Support for Behavioral Health and Wellness (MTSS-B) program in participating New Hampshire school districts for youths between the ages of twelve (12) to eighteen (18).
- 1.3. In connection with the performance of this MOU, the DHHS and the DOE shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations.


2. TERM

- 2.1. **Duration:** This MOU is effective upon the date of approval by the Governor and Executive Council through June 30, 2021. The parties may extend this MOU for up to one (1) year at any time by mutual written agreement, subject to the continued availability of funds, satisfactory performance of responsibilities, and approval by the Governor and Executive Council.
- 2.2. **Modification:** The parties may modify this MOU by mutual written agreement at any time, subject to the approval of the Governor and Executive Council.
- 2.3. **Termination:** Either party may unilaterally terminate this MOU upon written notice to the other party, in which case the termination shall be effective thirty (30) days after the date of that notice or at a later date specified in the notice. In the event of an early termination of this MOU for any other reason than the completion of services, the DOE shall deliver to the DHHS, not later than thirty (30) days after the termination, a "Termination Report" describing in detail all activities performed and the MOU funds used up to and including the date of termination. In the event the services and/or prescribed outcomes described within this MOU are not met to the satisfaction of the DHHS, the DHHS reserves the right to terminate this Agreement and any remaining funds will be forfeited. Such termination shall be submitted in writing to the DOE and will require the DOE to deliver a final Termination Report as described above.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE NEW HAMPSHIRE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

- 3.1. The DOE agrees to:
 - 3.1.1. Use the funding provided by the DHHS from the Governor's Commission funds only to support the implementation and maintenance of the MTSS-B Model.
 - 3.1.1.1. Begin implementing Phase 1: Exploration and Adoption by:

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3.1.1.1.1. Establishing an exploration team to institute team operating procedures to increase fluency with MTSS-B core features and practices.

3.1.1.1.1.1. The exploration team shall be comprised of key executive-level team members within the school:

3.1.1.1.2. Using data from current district-level partnerships and service contract assessments to determine program needs and to identify areas of redundancy with program fidelity and outcomes.

3.1.1.1.3. Determining the benefits of implementation by assessing the compatibility of MTSS-B with school districts and communities using a tool approved by the DOE.

3.1.1.1.4. Securing buy-in to increase confidence in the MTSS-B core features and practices with school administrators, teachers, school support staff, school boards, parents, community organizations serving youth, behavioral health organizations and other stakeholders by providing information sessions, presentations and technical assistance from the DOE in the facilitation of implementation.

3.1.1.2. Make funds available to local education agencies for program implementation and maintenance through an application process.

3.1.2. The DOE shall provide quarterly summaries on the progress of the use funds to the Governor's Commission and the DHHS. Any data provided in these summaries shall be aggregated and not include any personally identifiable information or other confidential information.

3.1.3. The DOE shall take appropriate steps to accept and expend the funds provided within the project period. The DOE agrees to submit quarterly invoices to the DHHS for costs incurred. Invoices must include a description of services and associated costs.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

4.1. The DHHS agrees to:

4.1.1. Provide funding to the DOE to support the implementation of the MTSS-B program up to a maximum amount of \$500,000 in State Fiscal Year 2021.

4.1.2. Pay the DOE within thirty (30) days of receipt of the approved invoices.

4.1.3. Monitor the expenditure of funds within this MOU by reviewing quarterly summaries and associated invoices provided to the DHHS by the DOE.

5. IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:



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- 5.1. Notwithstanding any provision of this MOU to the contrary, all obligations of the DHHS hereunder are contingent upon the availability and continued availability of funds from the Governor's Commission. The DHHS shall not be required to transfer funds from any other source in the event that such funds become unavailable. The DHHS may adjust encumbrances between State Fiscal Years within the price limitation through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.
 - 5.2. Disputes arising under this MOU which cannot be resolved between the agencies shall be referred to the New Hampshire Department of Justice for review and resolution.
 - 5.3. This MOU shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire.
 - 5.4. The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this MOU and shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.
 - 5.5. In the event any of the provisions of this MOU are held to be contrary to any state or federal law, the remaining provisions of this Memorandum of MOU will remain in full force and effect.
 - 5.6. This MOU, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire MOU and understandings between the parties, and supersedes all prior Memoranda of Understanding and understandings relating hereto.
 - 5.7. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity, such immunity being hereby specifically preserved.
