REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the New Hampshire Council on Developmental Disabilities to enter into an amendment to an existing Cooperative Project Agreement (CPA) with the University of New Hampshire, Institute on Disability (IOD), vendor #177867, Durham, NH, to explore a model of training Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) that is more relevant to the needs of the developmental disabilities community, by extending the completion date from June 30, 2023 to September 30, 2024, with no change to the price limitation, effective upon Governor and Council approval. The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on February 8, 2023, item #64. This is a fixed price agreement with 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

This request is to extend the availability of funds until September 30, 2024, due to the need for additional time to implement the training model for Direct Support Professionals (DSPs). Recruitment to the program has been slow; the extended time will allow for a broader outreach.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be used to support this expenditure.

Authorize the New Hampshire Council on Developmental Disabilities to enter into a **Retroactive** cooperative project agreement (CPA) with the University of New Hampshire, Institute on Disability (IOD), vendor #177867, Durham, NH, in the amount of \$52,745.80 to explore a model of training Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) that is more relevant to the needs of the developmental disabilities community, effective upon Governor and Council approval for the period of October 31, 2022 through June 30, 2023. EXPLANATION

This request is **Retroactive** due to a change in personnel that has left the Council short-staff which has impacted the length of time needed for this process.

This request is to support the University of New Hampshire, Institute on Disability (IOD) to run intensive training sessions for (6) Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) to successfully complete a one-year DOL-sponsored Direct Care Worker occupation apprenticeship program. Trainees will be currently employed as a Direct Support Professional in the state's area agencies or vendor agencies.

The project activities are to:

1. Create and work with an advisory team to establish and gain approval from the DOL for a new set of Direct Care Worker competencies.
2. Work with UNH Professional Development and Training to establish a new training program for DSPs in IDD.

3. Build two and stand up new online courses using UNH's online (Canvas) platform that provide challenging and relevant instruction specific to engaging people with IDD in community-based care, communication strategies, working with natural supports, and tools for care coordination.
4. Engage and support 2-4 NH DSP employers to become DOL Registered Apprenticeship sites.
5. Recruit and enroll 6-7 DSPs in the new program in collaboration with their employers, including gaining written commitments and consents, distributing trainee stipends, and supporting trainees to enroll and use Canvas, UNH's online learning platform.
6. Recruit and train on-the-job mentors and monitor progress towards competency attainment.
7. Continuously assess achievement towards project benchmarks and work with advisory team to establish a sustainability plan.

Critical shortages in the national and state healthcare workforce are well documented. Exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic, many direct care workers are leaving their jobs while the demand for community-based care has grown. Additionally, there is no system or framework for providing high-quality and robust training, mentoring, and supervision for direct care and paraprofessional workers. The IOD Building Futures Together team has successfully stood up an interdisciplinary training program with the infrastructure to support learners to engage in on-line and on-the-job training tailored to meet their needs. We will use this program structure to demonstrate the efficacy of a training program specifically tailored to the needs of Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) who work with individuals with Intellectual and Development Disabilities (IDD) and their employers.

It is important to note that most trainees in the Building Futures Together program have lived experience with substance use disorders, co-occurring mental health conditions, or trauma in their families. Most have limited experience with college-level work, many are caregivers for their own family members, and all are working directly with children, youth, and families who have extensive support needs. The Building Futures Together program provides each trainee with highly individualized intensive support and encouragement beyond the cash provided by the stipend. We will apply the same supports for trainees in the proposed DSP program. Of the seventy-nine trainees enrolled in the Building Futures Together program to-date, only five have dropped out, and many of the employers have stated that the program has advanced the skills and effectiveness of their staff.

About the Bid Process

The "Expanding the Public Health Workforce within the Disability Network: DD Councils" was released on June 24, 2022. The RFP was emailed to 614 individuals who work for disability organizations, posted on the New Hampshire Council on Developmental Disabilities (NHCCDD) website, posted on inklink, the paper copy of the NH Union Leader and NH Sunday News and on the Union Leader's website. Between September 23 and October 6, 2022, the five (5) proposals were reviewed and scored by the Executive Director, Director of Policy and Programs and the Chair of the Developmental Disabilities Council. It was determined that three (3) of the applications did not meet the

requirements of the RFP. The remaining two proposals, Great Bay Services, Inc. and the Institute on Disability (IOD) were both partially funded. The Great Bay Services, Inc. contract was approved at the December 21, 2022, Governor and Council Meeting, item 48 for \$40,000; the Institute on Disability is being awarded \$52,745.80.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be used to support this expenditure.

COOPERATIVE PROJECT AGREEMENT

between the

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, NH Council on Developmental Disabilities

and the

University of New Hampshire of the UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- A. This Cooperative Project Agreement (hereinafter "Project Agreement") is entered into by the State of New Hampshire, NH Council on Developmental Disabilities, (hereinafter "State"), and the University System of New Hampshire, acting through University of New Hampshire, (hereinafter "Campus"), for the purpose of undertaking a project of mutual interest. This Cooperative Project shall be carried out under the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement for Cooperative Projects between the State of New Hampshire and the University System of New Hampshire dated November 13, 2002, except as may be modified herein.
- B. This Project Agreement and all obligations of the parties hereunder shall become effective on the date the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire approve this Project Agreement ("Effective date") and shall end on 6/30/23. If the provision of services by Campus precedes the Effective date, all services performed by Campus shall be performed at the sole risk of Campus and in the event that this Project Agreement does not become effective, State shall be under no obligation to pay Campus for costs incurred or services performed; however, if this Project Agreement becomes effective, all costs incurred prior to the Effective date that would otherwise be allowable shall be paid under the terms of this Project Agreement.
- C. The work to be performed under the terms of this Project Agreement is described in the proposal identified below and attached to this document as Exhibit A, the content of which is incorporated herein as a part of this Project Agreement.

- C. Objectives:** This request is to support the University of New Hampshire, Institute on Disability (IOD) to run intensive training sessions for (6) Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) to successfully complete a one-year DOL-sponsored Direct Care Worker occupation apprenticeship program. Trainees will be currently employed as a Direct Support Professional in the state's area agencies or vendor agencies.
- D. Scope of Work:** The project activities are to:
1. Create and work with an advisory team to establish and gain approval from the DOL for a new set of Direct Care Worker competencies.
 2. Work with UNH Professional Development and Training to establish a new training program for DSPs in IDD.
 3. Build two and stand up new online courses using UNH's online (Canvas) platform that provide challenging and relevant instruction specific to engaging people with IDD in community-based care, communication strategies, working with natural supports, and tools for care coordination.
 4. Engage and support 2-4 NH-DSP employers to become DOL Registered Apprenticeship sites.
 5. Recruit and enroll 6-7 DSPs in the new program in collaboration with their employers, including gaining written commitments and consents, distributing trainee stipends, and supporting trainees to enroll and use Canvas, UNH's online learning platform.
 6. Recruit and train on-the-job mentors and monitor progress towards competency attainment.
 7. Continuously assess achievement towards project benchmarks and work with advisory team to establish a sustainability plan.
- E. Deliverables Schedule:** No later than March 1, 2023, an initial financial accounting report must be submitted to the NHCDD regarding expenditures to date and remaining funds. A final financial accounting report will be due at the conclusion of the funding period.

The Council will serve as a resource to support this project. The Institute on Disability may receive calls from the Council staff about outcome and performance measures, public policy issues that relate to this project, products and outreach materials developed with this funding, and project events.

As part of this grant, the Institute on Disability agrees to:

1. Provide surveys to project participants (or build in DD Council data collection metrics into their own surveys). The Council will work with the Institute on Disability to ensure mutually beneficial data collection for the project.

UNH IOD will use funds provided in FY 23 to support the Academy for Direct Support Professionals which will run through June 30, 2023

F. Budget and Invoicing Instructions: Upon approval of the Governor and Executive council and upon receiving an invoice from the Institute on Disability, a one-time payment of \$52,745.80 will be processed. This one-time payment will provide immediate available funds to assist with the payment of stipends and course fees. The NHCDD recommends that these funds be dedicated solely to stipends and course fees.

Federal fund expenditures must be spent and drawn down no later than 45 days after the closure of this contract. No later than 30 days after the closure of this contract, a final report must be submitted to the NHCDD.
