#10 Authorized to enter into a **sole source** amendment to an existing contract with PM Construction Co. Inc., Saco, ME (originally approved by G&C on 3/23/22, Item #30), for maintenance and repairs to firestop systems within the Acute Psychiatric Facility, by increasing the price limitation by \$21,000 from \$200,000 to \$221,000, with no change to the contract completion date of June 30, 2025. #27 Authorized, with Councilor Stevens voting **no**, the Bureau of Right-of-Way to grant a permanent access easement over state-owned property to a parcel of land located at 36 Horse Point Road in the Town of Belmont, NH. The Easement will be granted to JCB LLC at zero cost, subject to conditions as specified in this request. Effective upon G&C approval.
