The Department of Transportation requests placing this item on the Consent Calendar.

Under RSA 230:14, revise the membership for the Commission for the hearing on the proposed replacement of the deck of the Red List bridge carrying NH 49 over the Mad River (NH Bridge No. 239/152).

On September 20, 2023 the Governor and Executive Council authorized the Bureau of Right-of-Way’s petition for a hearing and the appointment of a Commission of Three Persons as Consent Calendar Item #4H. At the request of Councilor Cinde Warmington, the membership of the proposed Commission has since changed to include Hollie Burbank of Thornton, in place of Sandra Mucci who is unable to serve.

Since the petition is not for the limitation or control of access, this amended Commission of Three Persons should be appointed by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council to hold a hearing. The Commission shall determine whether there is an occasion for the bridge rehabilitation and improvements to the approaches.

I, William J. Cass, Commissioner of the New Hampshire Department of Transportation, under RSA 230:14, propose the rehabilitation of the Red List bridge carrying NH 49 over the Mad River (NH Bridge No. 239/152).

THORNTON 40613

The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate this Red List bridge with the replacement of its deck. The project also includes the installation of a temporary bridge and signals on Andy's Lane to maintain traffic through the work area during construction. The project begins several hundred feet west of the bridge and extends easterly for less than one thousand feet.

Wherefore I, William J. Cass, Commissioner of the New Hampshire Department of Transportation, under RSA 230:14 propose the replacement of the bridge deck on N.H. Bridge No. 239/152 and improvements to the approaches to the bridge from both directions.
