## REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Administrative Services (DAS), to accept and expend \$6,500,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for the purpose of Legislative Office Building (LOB) heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) improvements and the LOB garage repairs effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through November 30, 2024. This is an allowable use of ARPA SFRF funds under section 602(c)(1)(C) for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue. **Funding Source: 100% Federal Funds.**

Funds are to be budgeted in FY2024 in the following accounting units:

### EXPLANATION

The requested funds will be used for a much-needed HVAC project at the Legislative Office Building (LOB) and the Legislative Office Building (LOB) garage repairs.

Per a General Court of New Hampshire (GCNH) request, DAS contracted with an engineering firm to evaluate the mechanical systems in the LOB, which is the most densely populated State building during legislative sessions. The evaluation found multiple deficiencies with the existing air handling system. The existing air handling system did not have the heating/reheat coils needed to allow fresh air introduction into the building when temperatures fall below freezing, which requires that the existing air handling system be shut down during the winter months, resulting in minimum air quality standards not being met. It was also noted that outdoor air introduction minimums are not being met during the cooling season due to limited chiller capacity.

A temporary solution was developed, but it is not sustainable long-term; instead, complete replacement of the LOB air handling system is necessary. Replacing the obsolete and inadequate system will increase overall efficiency, ensure that current air quality standards are satisfied, and provide resiliency in the event of any future health-safety crisis. The additional \$6,000,000 is needed to complete the project now that we have an estimate of how much the project is expected to cost.

DAS will use these funds to complete the abovementioned deferred maintenance, installation and repairs project. The projects will be completed using contracted services with vendors. Current DAS staff, funded with previously approved ARPA funds, will provide both grant oversight and project management services.

When DAS originally estimated the costs for the deferred maintenance on the parking garage, the original estimate was low, necessitating the additional \$500,000 to effect the repairs.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 041 – Audit Fund Set Aside – at a rate of 0.1%

Class 048 – Contract Repairs: Bldg. Grounds - Includes design, maintenance, repair, and installation of deferred maintenance projects by contracted vendors. Services provided may include, but are not limited to, ductwork cleaning and filter changes, HVAC equipment and distribution system installation, HVAC controls installation and service, air balancing, HVAC repair work, and other services associated with this project.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds may be requested to support this program.
