REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Administrative Services to pay the National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO) (VC#456792), Washington, D.C., an amount not to exceed \$16,500 for Fiscal Year 2025 membership dues, from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval. **100% General Funds.**

EXPLANATION

Membership in NASBO is extremely important to the State of New Hampshire and the Department, as the association provides information about the financial actions of other states and allows us to learn from their results. NASBO relays what is happening at the national level that has a potential to impact New Hampshire, provides in-depth research and analysis on critical topics, and provides us with a group of highly informed professionals to access when questions arise. This is particularly important today as we implement measures to become a more efficient, effective and transparent state government. NASBO provides information to New Hampshire on how other states resolve problems, and raises issues of concern to all states regarding legislative changes ongoing in Washington. It provides us with a venue for list serve questions as we work to address efficiency, transparency, work-force planning and development, accounting, and budgeting issues. It allows the agency to track and compare our revenue progress with other states.

Listed below are answers to standard questions required for Governor and Council organization dues and membership approval submissions:

1. How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?

The National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO) was established in 1945 and the State of New Hampshire has been a member of the organization since the founding of the organization.

2. Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?

This is the only national organization which we are aware of that provides the kind of information that state budget officers and administrators have come to depend upon.

3. How many other states belong to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?

All 50 states and territories are currently members of NASBO. In New Hampshire, the Department of Administrative Services is the sole agency that is a member, so there is no duplication.

4. How is the dues structure established? (Standard fee for all states, based on population, based on other criteria, etc.)

The structure the National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO) uses to establish its dues is as follows: States are divided into 7 categories based on population. The eighth category is used for the territories and Washington, D.C. After each 10-year census, the categories are adjusted to reflect population changes.

5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?

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6. Are training or educational/research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.

All training materials and educational information are included in the cost of membership – NASBO does not charge extra fees for member publications.

7. Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams? Explain.

No, federal funds or grants do not occur as a result of this membership.

8. Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips.

While there is a registration fee for conferences, the annual membership fee includes the cost of travel (flight and hotel) for one person from each dues-paying state to attend the NASBO Spring, Annual, and Fall meetings, as well as the Analyst Professional Development Seminar. This allows State budget office staff to obtain information about practices in other states or specific information about federal budget activities.

9. Which state agency employees are directly involved with this organization? (Indicate if they are members, voting members, committee members, and/or officers of the organization.)

All staff members in NASBO-member budget offices are Associate members. Meetings are designed specifically to benefit Associate members, as staff are involved in various projects and surveys.

10. Explain in detail any negative impact to the State if the Agency did not belong to this organization.

The Department of Administrative Services is not affiliated with any other budget group. Without this affiliation, we would not have access to the following NASBO benefits:

- Member Roster and Contact Information for other state commissioners and budget officers, including subject matter experts across the country.
- Listservs and On-line Discussion Forums to utilize for quick member surveys and information. Through this Listserv benefit, the State of New Hampshire is able to gather national best practice information.
- Networking Forums: NASBO sponsors networking forums for subject-matter experts. These forums include webinars, year-round on-line discussion forums, and a network at the state's fingertips.
- Research and Publications: Access to research and publications include annual survey data.

- Technical Assistance – NASBO responds to calls and e-mails from budget officers and budget analysts in the states. Members frequently seek assistance from NASBO staff that can have an impact on state finances. The association also maintains a website for members to share information related to federal issues.
- Publications – NASBO publications are widely used. Members frequently utilize NASBO data for their reports or information so that they can compare their fiscal situation with other states. NASBO compiles and publishes the bi-annual Fiscal Survey of the States, the annual State Expenditure Report, and other reports such as the Budget Processes in the States publication. There is no charge for members for any publication or information.
- Reports - Every Monday members receive an in-depth report providing up-to-date information on important federal actions that impact the states. The Washington Report covers current federal and national fiscal issues. Every Wednesday when Congress is in session, the Washington Report Bulletin provides timely information on Congressional action and legislation. Every Thursday members receive a health care update to receive information on federal health care actions impacting the states.
- Meetings and Trainings - Training opportunities are offered for members in a variety of venues. For example, for over forty years NASBO has offered a well-regarded training program for new analysts. NASBO also holds several meetings a year to give budget officers the chance to interact with their colleagues. At the meetings, budget officers share tips and information as well as have a chance to hear from nationally recognized speakers and network with colleagues on various budgeting practices.

If we were not a member of this national organization, these benefits and services would not be available to the State of New Hampshire. The Department of Administrative Services respectfully requests Governor and Council approval of this request.
