Your Excellency and Members of the Council:

REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to reappoint Joshua L. Speicher, (Position #9U261, Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2904-013-500132), as an Assistant Attorney General, at salary level of \$103,000, effective on July 1, 2024, upon Governor and Executive Council approval, for a term ending June 30, 2029.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Speicher earned his Bachelor of Arts from Dartmouth College in 2009, and Juris Doctor from Northeastern University School of Law in 2013. Following law school graduation, he interned for the Honorable Ralph Gants at the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts. Mr. Speicher tried over 30 jury trials to verdict while serving as an Assistant District Attorney in Essex County, Massachusetts, from 2014 to 2017. Between 2017 and 2019, he was Assistant Corporation Counsel at the City of Boston Law Department litigating cases in state and federal courts; his municipal clients included the Boston Police and Fire Departments, Boston Centers for Youth and Families, and Boston School Department. He was a litigation associate at Lawson and Weitzen, LLP, in Boston, from 2019 to 2020, where his practice concentrated on environmental law. He joined the New Hampshire Department of Justice in May 2020, and was assigned to the Criminal Justice Bureau, where he prosecuted serious felony cases included homicides. Mr. Speicher was designated as a Senior Assistant Attorney General in 2023 to lead the Drug Prosecution Unit. He will continue with this assignment. His salary will remain the same. A copy of his resume is attached.


