REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to amend a **SOLE SOURCE** contract (PO # 1095418) with the University of New Hampshire-Survey Center, Durham, NH (VC# 315187-B057) by extending the end date to December 31, 2024 from June 30, 2024, to allow additional time to provide community outreach for our stakeholders. The original agreement was approved by Governor & Council on September 20, 2023, Item #122. This is a no cost time extension. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

This time extension is needed as the project will require additional public stakeholder engagement services by the University of New Hampshire-Survey Center (UNH) necessary to complete the Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP) due in August of 2025. The CCAP is one of the deliverables required under the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) \$3 million Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG). NHDES successfully submitted the first of three deliverables to the EPA by submitting the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) on March 1, 2024. The second deliverable will be the CCAP. The purpose of this contract has been for UNH to assist NHDES with the public/stakeholder engagement aspects of the PCAP and CCAP. The contract being amended by this request was Sole Source because UNH is uniquely qualified and experienced in engaging with New Hampshire communities. In addition, the UNH Survey Center has vast experience in working with state agencies in providing reliable information to guide programmatic decision making. The Granite State Poll is a monthly statewide scientific survey of public opinion on policy issues and has been a proven cost-effective means for interested parties to gather specific information. UNH performed one Granite State Poll during the development of the PCAP and another Granite State Poll is needed during the development of the CCAP as well. To date, \$84,244.40 of the \$264,145 budget has been spent.

The amendment has been approved by the Office of the Attorney General as to form, substance, and execution.

EXHIBIT A- Scope of Services

- A. Project Title:** Public/Shareholder Engagement for a Priority Climate Action Plan and NH Comprehensive Climate Action Plan
- B. Project Period:** The term of this Scope of Work shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until December 31, 2024, unless extended in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.
- C. Objectives:** Campus staff will develop and implement outreach and engagement strategies with identified shareholders and community members throughout the State of NH to garner input to inform the development of the Priority Climate Action Plan and the NH Comprehensive Climate Action Plan. Effective engagement in the development of the above noted Climate Action Plans will promote buy-in among shareholder groups, including those poised to implement activities outlined in the plans.
- D. Scope of Work:** Drawing on the Environmental Justice (EJ) Principles and Definition from the State website along with federal guidance through the Justice 40 Initiative, Campus staff will collaborate with State staff to provide/coordinate the following shareholder engagement supports with partners and networks. These activities will be more fully defined and designed as planning and framing meetings commence.
1. Attendance at planning and framing meetings with State team and partners.
 2. Coordinating content experts/liaisons with State team.
 3. Project management and shareholder engagement.
 4. Coordinating, Designing, and Facilitating Engagement Activities (NOTES: Some examples are here and in the timeline table below. These activities will occur in community spaces off campus) Examples include:
 - a. Convening 2009 Climate Plan Authors.
 - b. Cohort-based Learning Exchange Sessions and Coaching/Modeling for Public Engagement. Gathering a group of EJ Community shareholders and decision-making partners (e.g., connecting the pieces in the systems/structures, educational sessions about the impacts of greenhouse gas emissions to communities, participatory budgeting sessions, etc.) to build local advisory/cohort among EJ communities with links to the 9 regional planning commissions and 13 public health networks - among other partners that emerge. This may include:
 - i. Local site visits, field trips, and citizen science activities with a mix of members from underrepresented communities and decision-makers to talk and learn together about the climate hazards and need for prevention.

- ii. Photo Voice activities linked to what underrepresented community members are seeing and what they want to see in terms of climate improvements.
 - iii. Civic Health Mapping linked to Environmental Justice and Climate.
 - iv. Community/regionally based engagement with community-based groups: Local communities, nonprofits, businesses, organizations etc.
 - 1. Dialogue-based convenings with NH Listens
 - 2. Opportunities to draw connections with New Hampshire Center for Justice and Equity and Center for Impact Finance for sustainable engagement and means for local developments and implementation.
 - a. For example: Facilitate partnerships with schools in EJ communities and identify support for youth and family engagement programming. Explore use of participatory budgeting for implementation projects.
 - c. UNH Survey Center will develop: Two standalone surveys of New Hampshire residents as well as omnibus questions on the Granite State Poll (using Granite State Panel members);
 - i. Two surveys of 750 Granite State panel members (approximately 35 questions/12 minutes - same questions both times)
 - ii. Two closed-ended questions on the Granite State Poll

The UNH Survey Center will work with NHDES experts and Community Engagement Stakeholders to develop the questions. Planning grant partner meetings (offer dialogue-based activities to share findings and identify next steps collaboratively).

- 1) The State shall pay Campus an amount not to exceed \$264,145 for the services provided pursuant to this Exhibit A - Scope of Services.
- 2) This contract is funded through a Grant to the State of New Hampshire from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Climate Pollution Reduction Grant No. 00A01353.
- 3) Campus agrees to provide the services in Exhibit A, Scope of Service in compliance with funding requirements. Failure to meet the scope of services may jeopardize current and/or future funding.
- 4) Payment for said services shall be paid monthly as follows:
 - a. Payment shall be on a cost reimbursement basis for actual expenditures incurred in the fulfillment of this agreement and shall be in accordance with the approved items.
 - b. Campus will submit an invoice in a form satisfactory to the State which identifies and requests reimbursement for authorized expenses incurred in the prior calendar month. The invoice shall include labor cost and associated tasks accomplished. The invoice must be signed by an authorized individual for the State to initiate payment.
 - c. The State shall make payment to Campus within thirty (30) days of receipt of each invoice, subsequent to approval of the submitted invoice and if sufficient funds are available. Campus will keep detailed records of their activities related to State funded programs and services.

- d. The final invoice shall be due to the State no later than forty-five (45) days following the project end date of 12/31/2024. Requests submitted after this date may be denied.
- e. All obligations of State and the State of New Hampshire are contingent upon availability and continued appropriation of funds for the services.
- f. In lieu of hard copies, all invoices may be assigned by an electronic signature and emailed.

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to enter into a **SOLE SOURCE** cooperative agreement with University of New Hampshire, Durham NH (VC# 315187-B057) totaling \$264,145 for provision of public and shareholder engagement services, effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2024. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

Under the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) awarded a \$3 million grant to New Hampshire to create an updated Climate Action Plan. EPA has announced an additional \$4.6 billion in competitive grants that will be made available to eligible entities who file a timely Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) under this planning grant. These implementation grants could support a wide range of projects such as consumer incentives for energy efficiency improvements to homes and buildings, vehicle electrification, and implementation of the next generation of electrical grid technology. A significant focus of the EPA program is public input including ensuring that disadvantaged and underserved populations are provided the opportunity to have a voice in the development of the PCAP. NHDES is proposing a **SOLE SOURCE** agreement with the University of New Hampshire (UNH), to assist with development of the PCAP as UNH is uniquely qualified and positioned to engage with and gather input from all communities throughout New Hampshire.

New Hampshire's PCAP must be submitted to EPA by March 1, 2024 to ensure New Hampshire will be eligible to compete for the \$4.6 billion in implementation grants. Because this compressed timeframe does not allow sufficient time for NHDES to conduct a competitive solicitation for assistance in developing a PCAP, and because UNH is uniquely qualified and experienced in engaging with communities, NHDES feels a sole source agreement with UNH is justified. The UNH Survey Center has vast experience in working with state agencies to provide reliable information to guide programmatic decision making. The Granite State Poll is a monthly statewide scientific survey of public opinion on policy issues and is a proven cost-effective means for interested parties to gather specific information. The Survey Center has existing relationships with communities statewide, and it has expertise in conducting and validating responses to survey questions using the Granite State Poll, thus ensuring the accuracy of data generated. Further, the Survey Center is uniquely positioned to be able to



The UNH Survey Center will work with NHDES experts and Community Engagement Stakeholders to develop the questions. Planning grant partner meetings (offer dialogue-based activities to share findings and identify next steps collaboratively).

- 1) The State shall pay Campus an amount not to exceed \$264,145 for the services provided pursuant to this Exhibit A - Scope of Services.
- 2) This contract is funded through a Grant to the State of New Hampshire from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Climate Pollution Reduction Grant No. 00A01353.
- 3) Campus agrees to provide the services in Exhibit A, Scope of Service in compliance with funding requirements. Failure to meet the scope of services may jeopardize current and/or future funding.
- 4) Payment for said services shall be paid monthly as follows:
 - a. Payment shall be on a cost reimbursement basis for actual expenditures incurred in the fulfillment of this agreement and shall be in accordance with the approved items.
 - b. Campus will submit an invoice in a form satisfactory to the State by the twentieth working day of each month which identifies and requests reimbursement for authorized expenses incurred in the prior calendar month. The invoice shall include detail about hours worked and tasks accomplished. The invoice must be signed by an authorized individual for the State to initiate payment.
 - c. The State shall make payment to Campus within thirty (30) days of receipt of each invoice, subsequent to approval of the submitted invoice and if sufficient funds are available. Campus will keep detailed records of their activities related to State funded programs and services.

- d. The final invoice shall be due to the State no later than forty-five (45) days following the project end date of 6/30/2024. Requests submitted after this date may be denied.
- e. All obligations of State and the State of New Hampshire are contingent upon availability and continued appropriation of funds for the services.
- f. In lieu of hard copies, all invoices may be assigned by an electronic signature and emailed.

EXHIBIT B – SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS
