REQUESTED ACTION

1. Authorize the Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food (DAMF), Division of Agricultural Development to provide awards as indicated in the attached Table 1, not to exceed a total of \$113,538.75 from the DAMF Crop Loss Program to two (2) recipients effective upon Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2024. 2. Authorize DAMF to amend previous awards as indicated in the attached Table 2, increasing cumulative award amounts by \$1,264,068.50 from \$3,172,262.00 to \$4,436,330.50, with no change to the completion date, effective upon Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2024. This is an allowable use of ARPA SFRF funds under Section 602 (c)(l)(C) for provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue. **100% Federal Funds.**

EXPLANATION

On February 21, 2024, Governor and Executive Council approved the funding for the New Hampshire Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food Crop Loss Program (Item #59) for the purpose of providing one-time emergency assistance to agricultural operations that experienced significant crop loss due to frosts, freezes, or significant weather-related events between January 1 and November 1 of 2023.

DAMF accepted applications from eligible farms on a rolling basis through May 15, 2024. Requests for award authorizations for those over \$10,000 were submitted to the Governor and Executive Council in "batch" approval requests.

Awards for this program were initially set based on 50% of total adjusted net losses as determined through the application process. The goal of DAMF in setting this threshold was to prevent the program from being oversubscribed before all applications were processed. At this time, the application process is closed and available funding supports increasing the threshold to 75% of total adjusted net losses.

New Awards not to exceed \$113,538.75 and amendments to existing awards not to exceed \$1,264,068.50 are being submitted for approval by Governor and Executive Council as part of this request because they exceed the \$10,000.00 per entity threshold. Items with an * indicate initial awards under the \$10,000.00 per entity threshold.

To avoid delay in payments to these agricultural operations, you will notice on the table that some do not have vendor codes at the time of request. DAMF is working with Department of Administrative Services to verify existing vendor codes or create new ones for these districts.
