REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, the Department of Agriculture, Markets and Food, requests authorization to amend Fiscal Committee item FIS 24-088 approved on April 19, 2024 and Governor and Council item #43 approved on March 13, 2024, for the acceptance of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for the NH Meat Processing Infrastructure and Training Investment Program, by extending the end date from September 30, 2024 to June 30, 2025, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval. The item was originally approved by the Fiscal Committee on November 18, 2022 (FIS 22-405) and Governor and Council November 22, 2022 (item #57) and extended by Fiscal Committee on May 19, 2023 (FIS 23-166) and Governor and Council on May 31, 2023 (item #160). This is an allowable use of ARPA SFRF funds under Section 602 (c) (1) (A) to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts. No additional funding is requested. **100% Federal Funds.**

EXPLANATION

The purpose of this request was to address severe capacity limitations facing small and midsize livestock producers and ensure they have places to process their products and remain in business through the implementation of meat processing infrastructure grants, providing equipment and infrastructure upgrades for NH meat processing facilities, farms, and businesses that provide slaughter, processing, and custom butchering services. Additionally, the request was to address workforce needs in local food production, specifically in meat processing. Ongoing workforce challenges have led to significant staffing shortages in New Hampshire's meat and poultry processing facilities. The State does not currently have any meat cutting training, certificate-level



or above, and stakeholders have agreed that such a program is important for the sustainability of the industry.

This request will authorize the extension and continuation of the work being accomplished through these programs. While the meat processing infrastructure grants program is nearly complete, changes to the original plan for the certificate in meat processing and food safety program have required developing an alternative plan which has delayed its implementation. This extension will ensure that the full impact of the certificate program will be fulfilled addressing the workforce shortages and skilled labor development needs of New Hampshire's meat processing industry.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, the Department of Agriculture, Markets and Food, requests authorization to amend the Fiscal Committee Item FIS 22-405 (approved November 18, 2022) and Governor and Council item #57 (approved November 22, 2022), and as extended by Fiscal Committee Item FIS 23-166 (approved May 19, 2023) and by Governor and Council item #160 (May 31, 2023), for the NH Meat Processing Infrastructure and Training Investment Program, by adjusting the project scope for the Certificate in Meat Processing and Food Safety program and by extending the end date from June 30, 2024 to September 30, 2024, with no increase in funding, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval. This is an allowable use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) under Section 602(c)(1)(A) to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts. **100% Federal Funds.**

EXPLANATION

Funding through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for a Certificate in Meat Processing and Food Safety program as part of NH Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food's (DAMF) Meat Processing and Training Program was approved by Fiscal Committee on November 18, 2022 and by Governor and Council on November 22, 2022. The original proposal included a Mobile Meat Processing Laboratory to support in-person learning across the state as part of a comprehensive education program addressing the need for skilled labor in the meat processing industry. As the project moved from planning to implementation, rising costs in manufacturing have made purchasing a viable Mobile Meat Processing Laboratory impossible within the approved budget.


To fulfill the purpose of the Certificate in Meat Processing and Food Safety Program to train and educate the local workforce and support the region's agricultural industry by expanding awareness of career opportunities within the meat processing industry without a Mobile Meat Processing Laboratory, DAMF has worked with UNH Professional Development and Training Organization to develop an alternative plan. The revised program would feature a regional in-person, hands-on training program utilizing licensed partner facilities throughout New Hampshire offering real-life experience in a meat processing and packaging facility with direct instruction from industry experts and USDA Food Safety Inspection professionals. This new strategy would allow the first 100 interested learners to participate in the entirety of the program at no cost to them and provide funding for enhanced marketing and administration.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI and RSA 124:15, the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) is seeking approval on behalf of State Agencies to amend the accept and expend of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) requests by extending the end date for funding, new positions, and/or new Class 046-Consultants, created in relation to the acceptance of ARPA SFRF funds, from June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2024, effective upon approval of the Fiscal Committee and the Governor and Executive Council, 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The Department of Administrative Services is seeking approval, on behalf of the State Agencies listed in Attachment A, to extend the effective date of the attached items from June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2024. This extension is allowable under the "procedural rules amendment" approved at the previous Fiscal Committee meeting on April 21, 2023. All items included in the attachment have been previously submitted by the respective state agency responsible for the program and approved by both the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council. In addition, the Governor's Office of Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) has reviewed the attachment and concurs with the extensions requested.

While all ARPA SFRF must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026, this request only serves to authorize agencies' program balances that are unspent as of June 30, 2023, as well as positions and consultants created pursuant to RSA 124:15, to carry forward into FY24 and reauthorize projects or programs that were already intended to continue utilizing authorized ARPA SFRF into the next biennium. This will also grant agencies in coordination with GOFERR time to further evaluate projects and programs as the ARPA SFRF obligation deadline approaches in order to


ensure any funds that may need to be reallocated to other uses have sufficient time to do so. Any request to reallocate an existing budget or repurpose funds for new or existing projects will require future Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals and are not contemplated in this item.

If this item is not timely approved, the State would need to issue layoff notices to employees hired into these federally funded positions, created under the original ARPA request; agencies would halt work on time-sensitive projects or payments on existing contracts, and ongoing programs would be unable to issue or follow through on awards. Further, each agency would then need to submit a retroactive request to July 1, 2023 for approval to reauthorize the positions and funding; however, the retroactive requests would not eliminate the need to issue layoff notices in June 2023.

Typically, agencies budget for known federal grants in the upcoming biennial budget; however, the budget guidance issued in August 2022 instructed Agencies to exclude all COVID-related funding from their FY24-FY25 budget submissions in order to maintain the authorization methodology, compliance protocols, and audit trail that had become standard for use and oversight of ARPA SFRE. Moreover, although the funding is authorized by the federal government beyond June 30, 2023, including this one-time funding would have erroneously inflated the FY24-FY25 State budget.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support these programs. The Department of Administrative Services seeks approval of this request.

EXPLANATION

Certificate in Meat Processing and Food Safety - \$260,000 is requested to address workforce needs in local food production. Meat processing professionals are critical team members in the supply chain that moves agricultural animal assets from the farm to the table. However, recent ongoing workforce challenges have led to significant staffing shortages in New Hampshire's meat and poultry processing facilities. The State does not currently have any meat cutting training, certificate-level or above, and stakeholders have agreed that such a program is important for the sustainability of the industry.

The proposed Meat Processing and Food Safety program consists of a blend of hands-on in-person and online training programs to train and educate the local workforce as well as support the region's agriculture industry. This program will be administered by UNH Cooperative Extension and the UNH Professional Development and Training organization. To expand awareness of career opportunities within the meat processing industry and to increase the inclusivity and scope of training opportunities, a Mobile Meat Processing Laboratory is proposed. The mobile lab would allow for the program to travel through the region to high schools, vocational centers, and industry partners to conduct career orientations and hands-on training programs.

Meat Processing Infrastructure Grants - \$750,000 is requested to address the severe capacity limitations facing small and midsize livestock producers and ensure they have places to process their products and remain in business. Labor shortages and limited availability of USDA certified processing facilities have impacted production of local meat, despite growing demand. During COVID, many small and midsize meat producers were completely locked out of the processing schedule starting in early 2020 with waiting lists now averaging 18 to 24 months or more.

Equipment and infrastructure upgrades for NH meat processing facilities, farms, and businesses that provide slaughter, processing, and custom butchering services, provided through a grant program administered by the Department of Agriculture, Markets & Food, could alleviate these impacts and create new options for processing. The grant program would feature a match component, whereby applicants will contribute 15% of the requested funds and ARPA SFRF will provide 85%. The maximum amount that can be awarded in any one application will be \$200,000. Examples of eligible equipment can include items such as convection ovens, skinners, smokehouse, coolers, or mobile processing units designed for either poultry or beef.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 040 – Indirect Costs – to recover central services

Class 041 – Audit Fund Set-Aside - .001 of federal funds payable to DAS for audit fees per RSA 124:16

Class 072 – Grants - Federal – Discretionary – for disbursing out Federal Funds to assist the meat processing industry and related workforce as described in the explanation


