Your Excellency and Members of the Council:

REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to appoint Warren G. Cormack to Position #9U753 (Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-26110000-013-500132) as an Assistant Attorney General at a salary level of \$86,000, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or October 18, 2024, whichever is later, for a term ending October 18, 2029.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Cormack graduated from Washington University in St. Louis with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy-Neuroscience-Psychology in 2017. He received his Juris Doctor, *cum laude*, in 2021 from The University of Minnesota Law School, where he was Lead Managing Editor of *Minnesota Journal of Law, Science and Technology*. While attending law school, he worked as a Research Assistant at Shen Neurolaw Lab in Minneapolis (2019-2021) and clerked at the Hennepin County Attorney's Office, Adult Prosecution Division, and the Minneapolis City Attorney's Office (2020). In addition, he was an intern at this office (2019) and an extern for the Minnesota Senate Counsel, Research, and Fiscal Analysis Office (2020). Mr. Cormack has been published in the *Virginia Sports and Entertainment Law Journal*, *Minnesota Law Review*, and *Stem Cell Reports*. He is admitted to practice law in Minnesota, New Hampshire and Maine. Mr. Cormack joined the Department in 2022 and was assigned to the Consumer Protection and Antitrust Bureau where, among other duties, he ensured diligent enforcement of the tobacco Master Settlement Agreement. With this appointment, he will assume the duties and responsibilities of the recently established Data Privacy Attorney. His salary will increase by \$3,000 to \$86,000. His resume is attached for your consideration.


