### REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety to accept and expend \$488,933 (405e program) funds from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Federal Grant Program for providing grants to State and local law enforcement along with media campaigns with a focus on eliminating the number of deaths on NH roadways caused by distracted driving, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals through June 30, 2025. **100% Federal Funds**

Funds are to be budgeted in SFY25 in the following account:

### EXPLANATION

This request is being made due to the OHS receiving 405e “Distracted Driving” funding for the first time in SFY24 resulting in a new accounting unit being added using Federal Funding as the budget. Because this accounting unit was added after the approval of the SFY24/SFY25 Budget, there are no State funds budgeted in SFY25 to cover the expenditures for the Distracted Driving Programs.

These funds are necessary to use to be able to increase the visibility of law enforcement on New Hampshire roads to help reduce overall crashes and the resulting injuries and or deaths associated with distracted driving. These distracted driving funds will also support messaging to inform the motoring public of the dangers associated with driving while distracted to help change this negative driving behavior.

In 2023, New Hampshire distracted driving/inattention contributed to over 16% of crashes. However, non-fatal crash data and distracted driving fatality data may be under reported as there are many crashes that occur on New Hampshire roads with no other reason or explanation for the crash other than the vehicle left the road. Some of these crashes have occurred on a straight road, and a clear summer day with no explanation of how the crash occurred.

Class 029 – Transfers Within an Agency - to provide funding for grants to sub-grantees within the Agency.


Class 040 – Indirect Cost -SWCAP - as allowable for Contracts for Program Services.

Class 041 – Audit Fund Set Aside to comply with RSA 124:16 that requires all agencies which receive federal funds to set aside a percentage (0.1%) of the federal revenue amount received to pay for financial and compliance audits.

Class 102 - Contracts for Program Services to provide funding for grants to sub-grantees.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support the programs.
