Your Excellency and Members of the Council:

**REQUESTED ACTION**

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to grant a salary increase to Anthony J. Galdieri, Assistant Attorney General (Position # 9U260, Appropriation #02-20-20-201010-2620-013-500132), in the amount of \$4,000, from a salary level of \$121,000 to a salary level of \$125,000, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or May 30, 2025, whichever is later.

**EXPLANATION**

Mr. Galdieri is a resident of Chichester, and a member of the New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and United States Supreme Court Bars. He earned his undergraduate degree, *magna cum laude*, in 2004, from Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania. He graduated from the University of New Hampshire School of Law as a Daniel Webster Scholar and received his Juris Doctor in 2008. While in law school, he was Executive Editor of the *Pierce Law Review*, President of the Student Bar Association, and Teaching Assistant for Legal Writing I and II. Mr. Galdieri clerked for the New Hampshire Superior Court from 2008 to 2011—the last two years as Senior Law Clerk. He practiced at Nixon Peabody LLP in Manchester from 2011 to 2017 during which time he won the New Hampshire Civil Liberties Union's 2014 Bill of Rights Award, the 2015 Nixon Peabody LLP Pro Bono Attorney of the Year Award, and the 2016 Robert E. Kirby Award. He joined the Department of Justice in 2017, was commissioned as an Assistant Attorney General in January 2018, and was appointed Senior Assistant Attorney General and Civil Litigation Unit Chief in September 2018. In 2021, Mr. Galdieri was appointed Solicitor General. As Solicitor General he leads the unit responsible for representing New Hampshire, its agencies, and officials in all civil and criminal appeals in state or federal courts. He also develops *amicus curiae* briefs in cases of significant interest to New



Hampshire and makes recommendations whether to join *amicus curiae* briefs authored by other states. In recognition of his performance with this Department, I have designated him as an Associate Attorney General. His salary will increase by \$4,000 from \$121,000 to \$125,000. His current assignment will remain the same.

RSA 21-M:3 and RSA 94:1-a(I)(c)(3) provide that designation of positions, salary levels, and salary increases for attorneys at the Department of Justice shall be determined by the Attorney General, subject to approval of the Governor and Council, within appropriations made to the Department of Justice.

I respectfully urge your favorable consideration of this request. Thank you.
