REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the New Hampshire Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food, Division of Agricultural Development (NHDAMF) to **retroactively** amend FIS 23-210, approved by the Fiscal Committee of the General Court on August 11, 2023 and item #55, approved by the Governor and Executive Council on August 23, 2023 by extending the current end date from June 30, 2025 to September 29, 2025 to accept and expend \$33,489 from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to conduct programs benefiting New Hampshire for the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval. The Fiscal Committee approved the original request on January 21, 2022 item #FIS 22-021 and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on January 26, 2022 item #52. **100% Federal Funds.**
