REQUESTED ACTION

- 1) Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Energy to **retroactively** amend FIS 24-241 approved by the Fiscal Committee of the General Court on August 16, 2024 and item #077 approved by the Governor and Executive Council on August 30, 2024, by extending the current end from June 30, 2025 to December 5, 2025 to accept and expend \$8,622,066 of Federal Funds from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, under the Inflation Reduction Act, to provide financial and technical assistance to low-moderate income and disadvantaged communities to deploy and benefit from residential-servicing community scale distributed solar energy projects, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval. **100% Federal Funds**

- 2) Pursuant to RSA 124:15 and contingent upon approval of Requested Action #1, authorize the Department of Energy to **retroactively** amend FIS 24-241 approved by the Fiscal Committee of the General Court on August 16, 2024 and item #077 approved by the Governor and Executive Council on August 30, 2024, by extending the current end from June 30, 2025 to December 5, 2025 for the purpose of continuing the Department of Energy's two temporary full-time 13-1190 Miscellaneous Business Operations Specialist-4 (SOC13, Pay Band 5) program manager positions (9T3366 and 9T3365) and one 13-1190 Miscellaneous Business Operations Specialist-4 (SOC13, Pay Band 5) compliance position (9T3364), and extending Class 046-Consultants, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval. **100% Federal Funds**

EXPLANATION

This request is **retroactive** because the policy of the Fiscal Committee of the General Court is to act only on items within the current biennium and this is the first Fiscal Committee meeting in the new biennium. The Department of Energy (Department) received these funds from the United States Environment Protection Agency as a result of the Inflation Reduction Act. This was a competitive award made by the United States Environment Protection Agency based on a coalition application filed by the Department as the lead, with the New Hampshire Community Loan Fund (NH CLF) and New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NH Housing), providing a comprehensive and complementary approach to ensure the benefits of the program reach all corners of the state. On August 8, 2025, the Department received an update to the award ending the period of performance on August 8, 2025. This amendment will give the Department 120 days from the end of the period of performance to close out the grant as authorized under 2 CFR 200.344 (Code of Federal Regulations) and allow time for any review of the termination. Original funding is being left in the budgeted categories to allow for closeout of the grant and leave it available if there is any pause in termination. It was planned that the NH CLF and NH Housing would leverage their existing programs and relationships with Low to Moderate

Income communities. NH CLF were to target Resident Owned Communities (ROC) through their existing ROC program, which helps the residents of manufactured housing parks to purchase the park from the owners and convert them into cooperatives. NH Housing were to use the funding to finance and install community solar on workforce housing projects they either own or finance, while partnering with the state's eighteen public housing authorities to install solar on their properties as well. Lastly, the Department, serving as the lead applicant, planned to scale up the existing LMI Community Solar program, serving as a catch all to those communities or projects that do not neatly fit into any of those programs by the NH CLF or NH Housing.


