### EXPLANATION

This request is **retroactive** because the policy of the Fiscal Committee of the General Court is to act only on items within the current biennium and this is the first Fiscal Committee meeting in the new biennium. The Department of Energy received these funds from the U.S. Department of Energy's as a result of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). These funds are being provided to the state to provide rebates to households to undertake energy efficiency measures, within the confines of the issued program guidance and federal law.

This request includes two programs, both of which fall under the Inflation Reduction Act, Home Efficiency Rebates Program. One program (DE-SE0000106) is for rebates to install electric appliances, such as heat pumps, and one program (DE-SE0000050) is for rebates related to energy efficiency projects. Program launch is subject to a number of factors outside the control of the Department, including approvals by the U.S. Department of Energy. The request includes three positions; two program managers and an accountant.

During the administrative buildup of these two programs, the funds were initially accepted into one accounting unit. As additional tranches were released and more funds were accepted, it became clear the programs needed two separate accounting units. The programs are now tracked separately in two accounting units. Both programs have a current end date of July 31, 2028. The current award documentation for DE-SE0000106 has an end of October 31, 2025 but it is anticipated the award will be extended to July 31, 2028 to match the period of performance of DE-SE0000050.

**1) List of personnel involved:** Two temporary full-time 13-1190 Miscellaneous Business Operations Specialist-4 (SOC13, Pay Band 5) program manager positions (9T3337 and 9T3338) and one temporary full-time 13-2010 Accountants and Auditors-4 (SOC13, Pay Band 5) accountant position (9T3371).

**2) Nature, Need, and Duration:** These positions help the Department of Energy develop delivery mechanism, draft, and file applications for, and implement federal funding made available to the state from the Home Efficiency Rebate Program and Home Electrification Rebate Program, both funded through the Inflation Reduction Act. These positions are responsible for the administration of these funds, conducting request for proposal processes, vetting of proposals, contracting, contract management, filing any application and program updates and reports to the US Department of Energy.

**3) Relationship to existing agency programs:** These are working alongside staff working on other federal programs funded by the Inflation Reduction Act.

**4) Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied?** No


**5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request?** This is a one time grant.






