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Approval of this request will allow the Office of International Commerce (OIC) to continue using funds awarded through the U.S. Department of Commerce's International Trade Administration Market Development Cooperator Program (MDCP) to help New Hampshire businesses expand their ability to sell online to global customers.

Authorized by Congress in 1988, the MDCP is a cooperative program that provides financial assistance and access to the International Trade Administration's domestic and international networks to support new foreign market development. Its goal is to promote the export of nonagricultural U.S. goods and services.

With MDCP funding, OIC established the New Hampshire eGlobal Institute, building on the earlier Go eGlobal program. The Institute offers New Hampshire companies business counseling from OIC and public- and private-sector partners, highlighting the importance of a strong digital strategy. It also provides educational tools and resources to help companies implement strategies for selling internationally.

Since receiving the award, OIC has provided resources to more than 20 companies, supporting their international expansion efforts and beginning to collect export sales data. The remaining funds will be used to help companies implement digital strategies—such as developing web platforms for foreign markets, enabling payment in foreign currencies, and enhancing cybersecurity to meet global requirements.

The total grant amount awarded to OIC was \$181,034, through September 30, 2026.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 041 – Audit Fund Set-Aside – to comply with RSA 124:16 which requires all agencies which receive federal funds set aside a percentage (0.1%) of federal revenue amount received to pay for financial and compliance audits.

Class 102 – Contracts for Program Services – contract to pay for the establishing and marketing the program, hosting educational assets for New Hampshire companies to access and incorporate digital capacity and digital strategy in making international sales.

Indirect costs are not included in this proposal; this grant only allows for direct costs. Audit fund set-aside costs are a reimbursable expense for this program.

In the event Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to continue the support of this program.

The aim of MDCP projects is to promote the expansion of exports of nonagricultural goods and services produced in the United States. MDCP projects include a financial assistance component as well as access to the domestic and international network of International Trade Administration staff to leverage opportunities internationally.

This is first time that the State of New Hampshire has received an MDCP award. OIC will use the funding to establish a program designed to increase the digital capacity of New Hampshire-based companies that are looking to begin exporting or to expand their presence in foreign markets.

With the COVID-19 pandemic demonstrating the importance of having a virtual presence, being competitive in the digital marketplace has never been more important for business. Today, companies must be tech savvy, with a virtual presence built around a digital strategy that incorporates all facets of marketing, from online discovery through search engine optimization, to connecting with the right customer through localization efforts.

The MDCP funding will be used to establish a New Hampshire eGlobal Institute, building on the efforts that OIC started with its Go eGlobal program. The funding will be used for New Hampshire companies to get access to business counselling from OIC and public and private sector partners throughout the state, about the importance of having a digital strategy to do business internationally and the components important to keep in the forefront.

The total grant amount awarded to OIC is \$181,034.00, to run over a period of five years (ending on September 30, 2026). At this time, OIC is only requesting to accept and expend \$115,182.00, which is the portion of the grant award expected to be expended by the end of fiscal year 2023.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 041 – Audit Fund Set-Aside – payment of audit fee set aside associated with federal funding to comply with RSA 124:16 that requires all agencies which receive federal funds to set aside a percentage (0.1%) of the federal revenue amount received to pay for financial and compliance audits. The total revenue award for a period of five years is \$181,034.00.

Class 102 – Contracts for Program Services – contract to pay for the establishing and marketing the program, hosting educational assets for New Hampshire companies to access and incorporate digital capacity and digital strategy in making international sales.

Indirect costs are **not** included in this proposal: this grant only allows for direct costs.
