Your Excellency and Members of the Council:

**REQUESTED ACTION**

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to reappoint Camden D. Bisson, Position #9U361 (Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2904-013-500132), as an Assistant Attorney General at a salary level of \$83,000, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or October 5, 2025, whichever is later, for a term ending October 5, 2030.

**EXPLANATION**

Mr. Bisson, a resident of Derry, is a member of the New Hampshire and Massachusetts Bars. He earned a Bachelor of Arts, with a double major in Foreign Affairs and History, from the University of Virginia in 2015, and a Juris Doctor from the University of New Hampshire School of Law in 2022. After graduating college and before starting law school, he worked as a Staff Assistant for U.S. Senator Kelly Ayotte (2015-2017), and Coordinator of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce's Center for Capital Markets Competitiveness (2017-2019). During law school, he did internships with the New Hampshire Circuit Court (2020), New Hampshire Department of Justice (2021), and Rhode Island Attorney General's Office (2021). Following law school graduation, Mr. Bisson worked briefly as an Associate at Hamel Marcin Dunn Reardon & Shea, PC, in Hampton, before joining the Rockingham County Attorney's Office in 2023. As an Assistant County Attorney in that office, he was responsible for the prosecution of misdemeanor and felony-level offenses in Superior and Circuit Courts, which included eight jury trials. He joined the Department in 2024 and was assigned to the Criminal Justice Bureau's Drug Prosecution Unit. I plan to continue his current assignment. His salary will remain the same. A copy of his resume is attached.
