EXPLANATION

The Department of Health and Human Services requests to accept additional federal funds available from the CDC to support ongoing activity in the Public Health Infrastructure Grant. These are additional supplemental funds and carryforward funds from the previous grant period, originally awarded in December 2022. The current grant period goes through November 30, 2027.

The Public Health Infrastructure Grant (PHIG) reinforces the core capabilities of public health departments nationwide by offering long-term funding to support workforce development, foundational capacity, and data modernization. This additional funding will support ongoing development of the Department’s Environmental Health Data Management System, specifically inclusion of licensing, inspection, and other capabilities in support of the Public Health Food Protection program. The system serves more than 5,000 retail, dairy, bottled beverage, and other food entities in the State and enables the Department to execute activities in alignment with RSA 143, Sanitary Production and Distribution of Food, RSA 143-A, Food Service Licensure, and RSA 184, Inspection and Sale of Dairy Products.

The Department utilizes PHIG funding to support strategic activities that enhance core capabilities and serve the public interest. These include:

- Staffing for program evaluation, emergency preparedness communications and logistics, community-based food and nutrition activities, local health officer coordination, and more;
- Medical direction for the 13 Regional Public Health Networks to strengthen local health capacity;
- Enhancements to epidemiological analysis to deliver community-level cancer data and epidemiological support;
- Investments in workforce development and other activities for the Nashua and Manchester public health departments; and
- Support for data systems that serve lab specimen receipt, analysis, and result reporting, childhood lead prevention, food protection, radiological health, and local health officers.

Funds will be budgeted as follows:

- Class 041 – Audit Fund Set Aside - Funds will be used for audit fund set aside per state requirement.


