### REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, to accept and expend \$330,000.00 of federal pass-through funds from the New Hampshire Department of Justice for the purpose of supporting the J-One system expansion. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2026. **100% Fed Rev Xfers from Other Agencies.**

enforcement community that enables law enforcement personnel to track a particular offender from citation/arrest/summons through completion of all requirements associated with the adjudication of the associated offense(s). The J-One program supports the ability of criminal justice community partners to connect to the NH State Secure Communications Network to, in part, submit and manage criminal complaints to quickly and efficiently exchange such information.

This system greatly improves the effectiveness of protective orders by ensuring that law enforcement officials are immediately aware of any active protective orders and can issue proper service to respondents with outstanding orders. The timely processing and sharing of this information are critical to protecting petitioners as their cases proceed through the criminal justice system.


The following appropriations are being requested:

Class 103 – Contracts for Operational Services - Funds are needed for contract costs for the interface between CrimeStar RMS & the J-One Network.

The Department of Safety did not include this grant in the SFY 2026/2027 budget because we were not aware of the grant during the budget preparation.

In the event that Fed Rev Xfers from Other Agencies funds become no longer available General and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.
