REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to amend a grant agreement (PO#1098128) to Rolling Meadows Condominium, Londonderry, NH (VC #451063-R001), by extending the completion date to December 31, 2027, from June 1, 2026, and increasing the grant limitation by \$2,775,000 to \$4,895,000 from \$2,120,000 for interconnection to a municipal water system effective upon Governor and Council approval through December 1, 2027. The original grant was approved by Governor and Council on February 21, 2024, Item #114. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

NHDES, through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 funds, Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund (DWGTF), and the Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund (DWSRF), originally offered Rolling Meadows \$4,120,000 in a combination of grant and loan funds for an interconnection to a municipal water system to address per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) impacts. We are requesting approval of this amendment to provide Rolling Meadows with additional funding and time to complete an interconnection project to address PFAS impacts. The project is currently under construction and the water main on Nashua Road has been completed. Additional funds are needed as the bid to install a central distribution at Rolling Meadows and decommission the 19+ wells on the property was significantly above the original cost estimate.


Grant funding totaling \$18,914,000 has been made available to NHDES through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Emerging Contaminants in Small or Disadvantaged Communities (EC-SDC) grant program administered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). NHDES is using a portion of the funding to establish an emerging contaminant infrastructure grant program to mitigate the occurrence of emerging contaminants in eligible public water systems. Projects were initially selected based on exceedances of New Hampshire's Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs), to be eligible for funding. Subsequent projects were identified from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Project Priority List, and at minimum, have an exceedance of the EPA PFAS MCL.

To date, \$1,837,500 of the original \$2,120,000 in grant funds have been spent.

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In the event federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support this program. This grant amendment has been approved by the Attorney General's Office as to form, substance, and execution.

Amendment 1**

This Agreement (hereinafter called the Amendment) is by and between the State of New Hampshire, acting by and through its Department of Environmental Services (hereinafter referred to as the State) and Rolling Meadows Condominium acting by and through the President of the Board of Directors, Michelle LaMothe (hereinafter referred to as the Grantee).

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement (hereinafter called the Agreement) approved by the Governor and Council on February 21, 2024, the Grantee agreed to perform certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the State of certain sums as specified therein; and

WHEREAS, The Grantee and the State have agreed to amend the Agreement in certain respects;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

1. Amendment and Modification of Agreement: The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
 - (A) The Completion Date as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.7 of the Agreement shall be changed from June 1, 2026, to December 31, 2027.
 - (B) The Grant Limitation as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.8 of the Agreement shall be changed from \$2,120,000 to \$4,895,000.
 - (C) The Account Number as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.6 of the Agreement shall include 03-44-44-442010-6361-072.
 - (D) Delete Exhibit A, B and C and replace with Exhibit A – Amendment 1, Exhibit B – Amendment 1 and Exhibit C – Amendment 1. Exhibits A-C – Amendment 1 are attached hereto and incorporated into this amendment and agreement by reference.
2. Effective Date of Amendment; This Amendment shall take effect upon the date of approval of this Amendment by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire.
3. Continuance of Agreement: Except as specifically amended and modified by the terms and conditions of this Amendment, the Agreement, and the obligations of the parties thereunder, shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth therein.





I. FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

This Agreement is funded from:

- A. A grant to the State of New Hampshire (State) and subsequently through the Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) and New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) as approved by the Governor and Executive Council from the federal government through the Department of Treasury (Treasury) through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), with the source of funds being the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) identified under the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number #21.027. The Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN) for this award is SLFRP0145. This grant award is a subaward of SLFRF funds and any and all compliance requirements, as updated by Treasury, for use of SLFRF funds are applicable to the Subrecipient, without further notice. Treasury requirements are published and updated at <https://home.treasury.gov/policy-issues/coronavirus/assistance-for-state-local-and-tribal-governments/state-and-local-fiscal-recovery-funds>; and,
- B. A grant to the State from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Emerging Contaminants-Small and Disadvantaged Communities (EC-SDC) Grant Program under CFDA #66.442. All applicable requirements, regulations, provisions, terms and conditions of the EC-SDC grant is hereby adopted in full force and effect to the relationship between the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) and the Grantee.


FEDERAL FUNDING ACCOUNTABILITY and TRANSPARENCY ACT (FFATA). The Subrecipient shall comply with the terms of the FFATA by providing NHDES with their Unique Entity Identifier (UEI), and all applicable Executive Compensation Data information as required under the FFATA. A Unique Entity ID may be obtained by visiting <https://www.sam.gov>.

SAM REGISTRATION: The Subrecipient must have an active registration with the System for Award Management (SAM) (<https://www.sam.gov>).

GENERALLY ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES: The Subrecipient, if a governmental entity, shall maintain project accounts in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), including standards relating to the reporting of infrastructure assets as issued by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). The full text of Governmental Accounting Reporting Standards is available through the GASB website at: <http://www.gasb.org>

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RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS: The Subrecipient must maintain records and financial documents for five years after all funds have been expended or returned to the State and/or Treasury. Treasury may request transfer of records of long-term value at the end of such period. Wherever practicable, such records should be collected, transmitted, and stored in open and machine-readable formats.

Subrecipient must agree to provide or make available such records to the State and Treasury upon request, and to the Government Accountability Office ("GAO"), Treasury's Office of Inspector General ("OIG"), and their authorized representative in order to conduct audits or other investigations.


SINGLE AUDIT REQUIREMENTS: Recipients and subrecipients that expend more than \$1,000,000 in Federal awards during their fiscal year will be subject to an audit under the Single Audit Act and its implementing regulation at 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F regarding audit requirements. Recipients and subrecipients may also refer to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Compliance Supplements for audits of federal funds and related guidance and the Federal Audit Clearinghouse to see examples and single audit submissions.

CIVIL RIGHTS COMPLIANCE: The sub-grantee, contractor, subcontractor, successor, transferee, and assignee shall comply, and shall include in every contract or agreement funded with these funds this same requirement to comply, with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits recipients of federal financial assistance from excluding from a program or activity, denying benefits of, or otherwise discriminating against a person on the basis of race, color, or national origin (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq.), as implemented by the Department of the Treasury's Title VI regulations, 31 CFR Part 22, which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract (or agreement). Title VI also includes protection to persons with "Limited English Proficiency" in any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq., as implemented by the Department of the Treasury's Title VI regulations, 31 CFR Part 22, and herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract or agreement.

In order to carry out its enforcement responsibilities under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, NHDES may collect and review information from subrecipients to ascertain their compliance with the applicable requirements before and after providing financial assistance. Treasury's implementing regulations, 31 CFR part 22, and the Department of Justice (DOJ) regulations, Coordination of Non-discrimination in Federally Assisted Programs, 28 CFR part 42, provide for the collection of data and information from recipients and subrecipients (see 28 CFR 42.406).

PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE: This agreement will commence upon approval of Governor and Council and the Project, including all reports required by this Agreement, shall be completed in its entirety prior to the completion date shown in block 1.7 of the Grant Agreement G-1. All ARPA funds are subject to statutory requirements that they must be used for costs incurred by the recipient during the period that begins on March 3, 2021, and ends on December 31, 2024, and that award funds for the financial obligations incurred by December 31, 2024 must be expended by December 31, 2026.

GRANTS FOR RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT: This award is not a grant for research and development as defined in 2 CFR.200.1.

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PROCUREMENT, SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT: Recipients are responsible for ensuring that any procurement using these funds, or payments under procurement contracts using such funds are consistent with the procurement standards set forth in the Uniform Guidance at 2 CFR 200.317 through 2 CFR 200.327, as applicable. The Uniform Guidance establishes in 2 CFR 200.319 that all procurement transactions for property or services must be conducted in a manner providing full and open competition, consistent with standards outlined in 2 CFR 200.320, which allows for non-competitive procurements only in circumstances where at least one of the conditions below is true: the item is below the micro-purchase threshold; the item is only available from a single source; the public exigency or emergency will not permit a delay from publicizing a competitive solicitation; or after solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined inadequate. Subrecipients must have and use documented procurement procedures that are consistent with the standards outlined in 2 CFR 200.317 through 2 CFR 200.320.

Subrecipient shall fully comply with Subpart C of 2 C.F.R. Part 180 entitled, "Responsibilities of Participants Regarding Transactions Doing Business With Other Persons," as implemented and supplemented by 2 C.F.R. Part 1532. subrecipient is responsible for ensuring that any lower tier covered transaction, as described in Subpart B of 2 C.F.R. Part 180, entitled "Covered Transactions," and 2 C.F.R. § 1532.220, includes a term or condition requiring compliance with 2 C.F.R. Part 180, Subpart C. subrecipient is responsible for further requiring the inclusion of a similar term and condition in any subsequent lower tier covered transactions. subrecipient acknowledges that failing to disclose the information required under 2 C.F.R. § 180.335 to NHDES may result in the delay or negation of this assistance agreement, or pursuance of administrative remedies, including suspension and debarment. Subrecipients may access the System for Award Management (SAM) exclusion list at <https://sam.gov/SAM/> to determine whether an entity or individual is presently excluded or disqualified.

By entering into this agreement, the subrecipient certifies that the subrecipient is not debarred or suspended. Furthermore, the subrecipient certifies that no part of this contract will be subcontracted to a debarred or suspended person or firm.

PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SERVICES OR EQUIPMENT: This term and condition implements 2 CFR 200.216 and is effective for obligations and expenditures of EPA financial assistance funding on or after 8/13/2020. As required by 2 CFR 200.216, EPA recipients and subrecipients, including borrowers under EPA funded revolving loan fund programs, are prohibited from obligating or expending loan or grant funds to procure or obtain; extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain; or enter into a contract (or extend or renew a contract) to procure or obtain equipment, services, or systems that use covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. As described in Public Law 115-232, section 889, covered telecommunications equipment is telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities).

Recipients, subrecipients, and borrowers also may not use EPA funds to purchase:

- a. For the purpose of public safety, security of government facilities, physical security surveillance of critical Page 4 of 29 infrastructure, and other national security purposes, video surveillance and

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telecommunications equipment produced by Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities).

- b. Telecommunications or video surveillance services provided by such entities or using such equipment.
- c. Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.


Consistent with 2 CFR 200.471, costs incurred for telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment such as phones, internet, video surveillance, and cloud servers are allowable except for the following circumstances:

- a. Obligating or expending EPA funds for covered telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment or services as described in 2 CFR 200.216 to:
 - (1) Procure or obtain, extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain;
 - (2) Enter into a contract (or extend or renew a contract) to procure; or
 - (3) Obtain the equipment, services, or systems. Certain prohibited equipment, systems, or services, including equipment, systems, or services produced or provided by entities identified in section 889, are recorded in the System for Award Management exclusion list which can be found at <https://www.sam.gov/SAM/pages/public/index.jsf>.

BUILD AMERICA, BUY AMERICA ACT: BIL creates the Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act domestic sourcing requirements for Federal financial assistance programs for infrastructure, including the drinking water grant programs. BABA expands the emphasis on domestically produced products in federally funded projects beyond AIS. In addition to domestic iron and steel, it requires the use of domestic manufactured products and construction materials to be used in any federal financial assistance program for infrastructure. Its inclusion of domestic iron and steel requirements crosscuts AIS requirements into BABA, meaning that BABA's requirements for domestic iron and steel must follow the AIS requirements.

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE): Pursuant to 40 CFR, Section 33.301, the Loan Recipient shall make good faith efforts to utilize small, minority and women's business enterprises whenever procuring construction, equipment, services and supplies under an EPA financial assistance agreement, and shall require that prime contractors also comply. Records documenting compliance with the six good faith efforts shall be retained.



II. FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO ARPA INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS OVER \$10M

For projects over \$10 million (based on expected total cost) a recipient shall provide a certification that, for the relevant project, all laborers and mechanics employed by contractors and subcontractors in the performance of such project are paid wages at rates not less than those prevailing, as determined by the U.S. Secretary of Labor in accordance with subchapter IV of chapter 31 of title 40, United States Code (commonly known as the “Davis-

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Bacon Act”), for the corresponding classes of laborers and mechanics employed on projects of a character similar to the contract work in the civil subdivision of the State (or the District of Columbia) in which the work is to be performed. All contracts and subcontracts for the construction of treatment works shall insert in full in any contract the standard Davis-Bacon contract clause as specified by 29 CFR §5.5(a).

III. OTHER SPECIAL PROVISIONS

In addition to the above special provisions, the following provisions as required by federal regulations apply to this Agreement:


1. **Financial management.** *The Contractor shall comply with 2 CFR part 200 Subpart D and the specific standards regarding financial reporting, accounting records, internal control, budget control, allowable cost, source documentation, and cash management outlined therein.*
2. **Allowable and indirect costs.** All costs charged to this Agreement shall be eligible, necessary, and reasonable for performing the tasks outlined in the approved project scope of services. The costs, including match, shall be incurred during the period of performance of the project, and shall be allowable, meaning that the costs must conform to specific federal requirements detailed in 2 CFR part 200 Subpart E. The Grantee’s indirect cost rate is ____, or if Grantee does not have an established indirect cost rate, indirect costs shall not exceed 15%. The Grantee may elect not to charge indirect costs.
3. **Property Management.** The Contractor shall comply with the property management and procedures detailed in 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart D, if applicable.
4. **Restrictions on Lobbying.** The Contractor shall comply with the terms of 15 CFR part 28 and 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart E which prohibit the use of federal Contract funds to influence (or attempt to influence) a federal employee and requires the submission of Standard Form LLL ("Disclosure of Lobbying Activities") if nonfederal funds have been used to influence (or attempt to influence) a federal employee.
5. **Drug-Free Workplace.** The Contractor shall comply with the terms of 2 CFR part 1329 which require that as a condition of the Agreement, certification that they maintain a drug-free workplace. By signing and submitting the Agreement, the Contractor certifies that he or she will not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance in conducting any activity associated with the Agreement.
6. **Protection for Whistleblowers.** The Contractor shall comply with the terms of 41 U.S.C. §471 regarding Whistleblower protections. As described in 41 USC §471 “an employee of a contractor, subcontractor, grantee, or subgrantee or personal services contractor may not be discharged, demoted, or otherwise discriminated against as a reprisal for disclosing to a person or body described in paragraph (2) information that the employee reasonably believes is evidence of gross mismanagement of a Federal contract or grant, a

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gross waste of Federal funds, an abuse of authority relating to a Federal contract or grant, a substantial and specific danger to public health or safety, or a violation of law, rule, or regulation related to a Federal contract (including the competition for or negotiation of a contract) or grant.”

Rolling Meadows Condominium (Rolling Meadows) will use American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund (DWGTF), and Emerging Contaminant, Small and Disadvantaged Community (EC-SDC) grant funding to interconnect with Pennichuck Water Works Londonderry public water system to address per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) present within the community's drinking water sources. Grant and loan funds will be used for the required environmental review, engineering design, construction of water main and a consolidated distribution system, decommissioning of contaminated wells and associated infrastructure, construction oversight, and other associated eligible project costs.

As a requirement of this grant funding, Rolling Meadows is required to develop a business plan for the funded improvements and provide documentation supporting compliance with this requirement.

NHDES shall pay to the Grantee the total reimbursable program costs in accordance with the following requirements:

Reimbursement requests for program costs shall be made no more than once per calendar month by the Grantee using the Disbursement forms as supplied by NHDES, which shall be completed and signed by the Grantee. The disbursement form shall be accompanied by proper supporting documentation based upon direct costs. The Grantee will maintain adequate documentation to substantiate all Program related costs. All work shall be performed to the satisfaction of NHDES before payment is made.

The funding for eligible drinking water improvement costs is a combination of an ARPA grant of \$1,500,000, a DWGTF grant of \$620,000, an EC-SDC grant of \$2,775,000, and a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Emerging Contaminant (EC) loan of \$2,000,000, to be used as outlined in the table below. Each disbursement request will be paid 100% of eligible expenses as ARPA grant funds not to exceed \$1,500,000; second from the EC-SDC grant not to exceed \$2,775,000; third DWSRF EC loan not to exceed \$2,000,000; and fourth from DWGTF not to exceed \$282,500. To the greatest extent practicable, ARPA grant funds shall be fully disbursed prior to disbursing other grant and loan funds and no later than September 1, 2026.

Each DWGTF disbursement request for upsizing the water main will be paid 100% of eligible expenses as grant funds not to exceed \$337,500.


