REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Administration, to amend the grant agreements, as listed below, with eligible New Hampshire nonprofit organizations under the FY 2023 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) by extending the agreement completion date from August 31, 2026, to December 31, 2026, to align with the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) revised Period of Performance, with no change to the price limitation of **\$2,104,092.00**, effective upon Governor and Council approval. These grant agreements were originally approved by the Governor and Executive Council on November 8, 2023, Item #142. **100% Federal Funds.**

EXPLANATION

The purpose of this request is to amend the grant agreements, as listed, by extending the agreement end date to reflect the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) revised Period of Performance for the FY 2023 NSGP. The amendments will provide participating nonprofit organizations additional time to complete approved grant activities and satisfy all applicable federal grant requirements within the revised federal performance period.

The FY 2023 NSGP, administered by FEMA, provides federal funding to eligible nonprofit organizations to support physical and cyber security enhancements and other security-related activities designed to prevent, protect against, prepare for, and respond to acts of terrorism. The Department serves as the State Administrative Agency and is responsible for administering the program on behalf of FEMA.

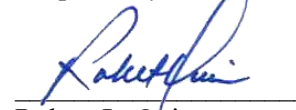
No additional funding is being requested, and there are no changes to the approved grant amounts, scope of work, or other material terms and conditions of the grant agreements.

Pursuant to Section 20 of the Grant Agreement (Form G-1, General Provisions), the grant agreements may be amended upon approval by the Governor and Executive Council, when required, or by the signing State agency, as applicable. Approval of this request will authorize the Department to execute the amendments following final approval by the New Hampshire Attorney General's Office, without requiring further action by the Governor and Executive Council.

Grant Agreement with The New Hampshire Department of Safety
Nonprofit Security Grant Program
Amendment No. 1

This Agreement (hereinafter called the Amendment) is by and between the State of New Hampshire, acting by and through its Department of Safety (hereinafter referred to as the State) and the Nonprofit Security Grant Program Homeland Security Grant Program acting by and through the Authorized Individual, (hereinafter referred to as the Grantee).

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement (hereinafter called the Agreement) approved by the Governor and Council on November 8, 2023, item 142, the Grantee agreed to perform certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the State of certain sums as specified therein; and

WHEREAS, The Grantee and the State have agreed to amend the Agreement in certain respects;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows;

1. Amendment and Modification of Agreement: The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
 - a. The completion Date as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.7 of the Agreement shall be changed to December 31, 2026 from August 31, 2026

All other conditions outlined in the contract shall remain in effect.
2. Effective Date of Amendment: This Amendment shall take effect upon the date of approval of this Amendment by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire.
3. Continuance of Agreement: Except as specifically amended and modified by the terms and conditions of this Amendment, the Agreement, and the obligations of the parties thereunder, shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth therein.

1. Grant expenses must be incurred and paid prior to December 31, 2026. All grant reimbursement requests must be submitted prior to January 15, 2027. Only expenses approved as outlined in Exhibit C may be reimbursed. Reimbursement requests shall meet all requirements in the DHS Terms and Conditions and Special Conditions.
2. "The Grantee" shall maintain financial records, supporting documents, and all other pertinent records for a period of 7 years from the last GAN.
3. Per 2 CFR 200 and Subpart F, the organization must submit its most recent audit each fiscal year to be subject to a risk assessment testing for fiscal practices and capabilities.
4. Per 2 CFR 200 and Subpart F, Non-Federal entities that expend \$1,000,000 or more in federal funds (from all sources including pass-through sub recipient) in the organizational fiscal year shall have a single organization-wide audit conducted and submitted to Grants Management Bureau.
5. **Equipment:** The subrecipient agrees that, when practicable, any equipment purchased with grant funding shall be prominently marked as follows: "Purchased with funds provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and the NH Department of Safety - Grants Management Bureau." Additionally, when practicable, any equipment purchased with funding under this agreement shall bear on it the logos of the NH Department of Safety - Grants Management Bureau and U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

EXHIBIT B - Amendment 1
SCOPE OF SERVICES

1. The Department of Safety, (hereinafter referred to as “the State”) is awarding the GRANTEE (hereinafter referred to as “the Grantee”) \$AMOUNT for the purpose of local first responders statewide for executing anti-terrorism linked eligible training, exercises and procuring eligible equipment.
2. “The Grantee” agrees that the project grant period ends December 31, 2026, and that all expenses must be incurred and paid prior to this date and reimbursement requests submitted to the Department of Safety, Grants Management Bureau, prior to January 15, 2027.
3. “The Grantee” agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, rules, regulations, and requirements.
4. “The Grantee” is responsible for the overall direction and assignment of all 2025 Homeland Security grant
5. Reimbursement requests must be submitted on a monthly basis for overtime of the Tier III participant in the Intelligence Liaison Officer Program (ILO)

GRANT AMOUNT AND METHOD OF PAYMENT
