REQUESTED ACTION

The New Hampshire Department of Energy (Department) requests authority to continue its membership and participation in the National Association of State Energy Officials (NASEO), Vendor #170418, for an amount of \$4,927.75, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval for the period October 1, 2026 through September 30, 2027. **100% Federal Funds.**

EXPLANATION

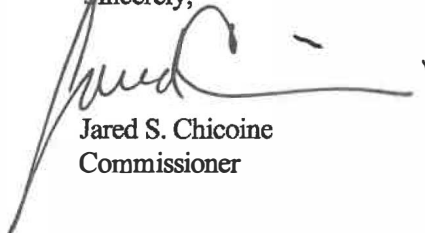
Approval of this request will enable the department to pay annual membership dues to the National Association of State Energy officials (NASEO). NASEO supports the energy policy, planning and program efforts of the 56 state energy offices, territories, and the District of Columbia. NASEO facilitates regional discussions for states to share best practices on energy policies and programs; works on behalf of the States and Territories with many federal agencies, such as the US Department of Energy, US Department of Homeland Security, and the Environmental Protection Agency; and provides support for the state's electric sector planning and access to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), as well as other initiatives. NASEO has been instrumental in assisting the state in planning for and operationalizing funds from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). A copy of the invoice is attached for your review.

1. **How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?** NASEO was formed in 1986, and New Hampshire has been a member since 1986.
2. **Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?** There are no other national organizations that support state energy officials.
3. **How many other states belong to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?** All 50 states, Washington DC, and 5 territories. The Department is the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member.

- 4. How is the dues structure established? (Standard fee for all states, based on population, based on other criteria, etc.)** There is a base amount of \$4,479.77 paid by every state, with an additional \$223.99 paid per Congressional district in the state. With two Congressional districts, New Hampshire's rate is calculated as $\$4,479.77 + (\$223.99 \times 2) = \$4,927.75$. Elements of the dues are indexed to inflation and rounded up or down to the whole penny where needed.
- 5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?** New Hampshire receives regular updates on actions in Washington DC impacting funding and program requirements, educational resources for staff, technical expertise and advice on programs, and advocacy in Washington DC at the federal agencies as well as an expansive peer to peer network allow staff to connect with energy staff in other states and regions, allowing for sharing of information and solutions to common challenges, be it program implementation, compliance reporting requirements, cybersecurity exercises, or transmission planning. These opportunities allow the Department to more effectively manage roughly \$140 million in federal funding, ensuring that the federal taxpayer's money is spent prudently, and New Hampshire residents and businesses can get the greatest benefit from these programs.
- 6. Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.** Indirectly. Membership allows participation in a variety of learning opportunities such as working groups and panel discussions via platforms such as Zoom.
- 7. Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams? Explain.** Membership is not required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams.
- 8. Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips.** No travel is included in this membership fee.
- 9. Which state agency employees are directly involved with this organization? (Indicate if they are members, voting members, committee members, and/or officers of the organization?)** Membership is for the Department as a whole, however the staff members that have the most interaction are Joshua Elliott, Megan Stone, and Denise Sleeper.
- 10. Explain in detail any negative impact to the State if the Agency did not belong to this organization.** New Hampshire would lose access to the valuable resources that NASEO provides, such as educational resources for staff, and technical expertise and advice on programs.
